• Charge the battery pack (supplied) before using the camera for the first time.

• The LCD screen is manufactured using extremely high-precision technology so over 99.99% of the pixels are operational for effective use. However, there may be some tiny black points and/or bright points (white, red, blue or green in color) that constantly appear on the LCD screen. These points are normal in the manufacturing process and do not affect the recording in any way.



· The camera is a precision instrument. Be careful not to bump the lens or the LCD screen, and not to apply force to it. Attach the strap to prevent the camera from damage by being dropped, etc.

If you continue charging the battery pack for about one more hour (until it is **fully** 

### charged), the charge will last slightly longer.

#### • Connect the battery charger to an easily accessible wall outlet (wall socket) close by • Even if the CHARGE lamp is not lit, the battery charger is not disconnected from the AC power source

(mains) as long as it is connected to the wall outlet (wall socket). If some trouble occurs while using the battery charger, immediately shut off the power by disconnecting the plug from the wall outlet (wall socket). • When charging is finished, disconnect the power cord (mains lead) from the wall outlet (wall socket), and remove the battery pack from the battery charger.

• The time required to fully charge the battery pack (supplied) from when it is completely discharged at a temperature of 25°C (77°F) is approximately 330 min., and the practical charging time is approximately 270 min. Charging may take longer under certain circumstances or conditions.

#### To change the date and time

Select [Clock Set] in the 🚔 (Setup) screen and perform the procedure in step 3 above. → "User's Guide/Troubleshooting" (pages 46 and 55)

#### On the clock display

• Midnight is indicated as 12:00 AM, and noon as 12:00 PM. • If you selected [D/M/Y] in step 3-1, set the time on a 24-hour cycle.

#### When turning on the power

• Unless you set the clock, the Clock Set screen appears each time the camera is turned on.



#### To turn off the power

Press the POWER button again. • If the camera is running on battery power and you do not operate the camera for about three minutes, the camera turns off automatically to prevent wearing down the battery pack (Auto power-off function).

### Changing the language setting

You can change the screen display to show messages in a specified language. To change the language setting, press MENU to display the menu screen. Select 🚔 (Setup) with the control button, then, select [A Language] in  $\stackrel{\bullet}{=}$  (Setup1), and select the desired language.  $\rightarrow$  "User's Guide/Troubleshooting" (page 53)
