### Placement

Avoid placing the unit in areas of:

### Stacking

Place the unit in a horizontal position, and do not place anything heavy on it.

### Condensation

Moisture may form on the lens in the following conditions:

- immediately after a heater has been turned on
- in a steamy or very humid room
- when the unit is suddenly moved from a cold environment to a warm one If moisture forms inside the unit, it may not operate properly. In this case, turn on the power and wait about one hour for the moisture to evaporate.

#### If there is noise interference on the TV while a broadcast is being received

Depending on the reception condition of the TV, interference may appear on the TV monitor while you watch a TV broadcast and the unit is left on. This is not a malfunction of the unit or the TV. To watch a TV broadcast, turn off the unit.



### Angle

Recorded onto some DVD discs are scenes which have been simultaneously shot from a number of different angles (the same scene is shot from the front, from the left side, from the right side, etc.). With such discs, the ANGLE button can be used to view the scene from different angles.

### **Chapter Number**

These numbers are recorded on HDD and DVD discs. A title is subdivided into many sections, each of which is numbered, and specific parts of video presentations can be searched quickly using these numbers.

### DVD

A high-density optical disc on which high-quality pictures and sound have been recorded by means of digital signals. Incorporating a new video compression technology (MPEG II) and high-density recording technology, DVD enables aesthetically pleasing full-motion video to be recorded over long periods of time (for instance, a whole movie can be recorded). A DVD disc normally has 4.7GB capacity and is able to record 2hrs of high quality DVD movie.

### DVD+R

This means DVD+Recordable. These Discs can be recorded and finalized only once.

### DVD+RW

This means DVD+ReWritable. These Discs can be recorded on repeatedly.

### Finalize

After being recorded and finalized, the recorded disc can be played back on a regular DVD player if the DVD player can take DVD+R discs.

### HDD

HDD refers to the internal hard disc drive of the recorder. It is a fragile piece of equipment. Backing up important recordings onto DVD+R/RW is recommended in order to protect against accidental loss.

### Subtitles

These are the printed lines appearing at the bottom of the screen which translate or transcribe the dialogue. They are recorded on DVD discs.

### **Play Time**

This indicates the play time which has elapsed from the start of a disc or a title. It can be used to find a specific scene quickly. (It may not work with some discs.)

### **Title Number**

These numbers are recorded on DVD discs. When a disc contains two or more movies, these movies are numbered as title 1, title 2, etc.

### **Track Number**

These numbers are assigned to the tracks which are recorded on audio CDs. They enable specific tracks to be located quickly.

## **About the Internal HDD:**

Please use the recorder following the guidelines below to protect against possible HDD failure. It is recommended to always back up important recordings onto DVD+R/RW discs in order to protect against accidental loss.

- O Install and operate the recorder on a stable and level surface
- **O** Do not move the recorder while it is on
- **O** Do not block the rear vent/cooling fan
- O Do not move the recorder immediately after switching it off
- O Do not use the recorder in places that may be subject to sudden changes in temperature, or in excessively hot or humid environmental conditions
- **O** It could cause loss of recording data if there is a power failure during recording programs.
- As the recorder is switched on, do not unplug from the wall socket or switch the electricity off from the breaker switch.

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Getting Started

This section covers significant information about the unit's general behavior. Please read the below information carefully.

- As turning on the HDD+DVD Recorder, the unit directly enters to DVD mode.
- □ If a disc is already placed on the disc tray, the reocrder will start to load the disc right after power is turned on. It will be invalid by pressing HDD/DVD to switch to HDD mode or Source to change connected source during loading.
- □ If Auto Play is set on, the recorder will start to play the disc or display its menu after loading.
- **T** switch to HDD mode, please do the following:
- **1.** If there is no disc placed in the recorder, press  $\bigcirc$  HDD/DVD on the remote control to switch to HDD mode.
- If there is a disc placed in the recorder, press 
   Stop twice to completely stop DVD playback. Press 
   HDD/DVD on the remote control to switch to HDD mode.
- □ When pressing **● Stop** for a first time during DVD playback, the recorder turns to a pre-stop status and memorizes the position where the playback is stopped. To start play from where the playback has been stopped, press **● Play**.
- If intending to completely stop DVD playback in order to operate the other functions in pass-through mode, press Stop for a second time following the previous stop operation.
- When recording programs to a DVD+RW or DVD+R disc, after the disc is loaded and its disc menu is displayed on the screen, press Record once to switch the recorder to record mode. Then press Source to select a preferred source for recording. To start the recording, press Record again.
- □ To display the title menu during HDD playback, press Menu or Title. To leave the menu, press Play.
- □ To return to the title menu during DVD playback, press Menu or Title.
- $\Box$  As  $\bigotimes$  appears on the right top corner of the screen, it indicates that the action is prohibited or not available.

For example, to view programs at night without disturbing other people, DRC function can help to achieve the effect.

• After pressing  $\bigcirc$  Menu or  $\bigcirc$  Title to go back to the title menu, a Change Thumbnail box appears. It might take 15~30 seconds before the new index picture appears on the title menu.

Before requesting service for the HDD+DVD Recorder, check the chart below for a possible cause of the problem you are experiencing. Some simple checkups or a minor adjustment on your part may eliminate the problem and restore proper operation.

SYMPTOM (COMMON)	REMEDY
No power. The recorder does not start playback when PLAY is pressed.	<ul> <li>Insert the power plug securely into the power outlet.</li> <li>Check if the ON/OFF button on the front of the recorder is set to on.</li> <li>Check if no power at the AC outlet by plugging in another appliance for a test.</li> <li>Condensation has formed: wait about 1 to 2 hours to allow the recorder to dry out.</li> <li>The recorder cannot play discs other than DVDs and audio CDs.</li> <li>Check if the disc is defective by trying another disc.</li> <li>Check the region (local) code.</li> </ul>
The recorder starts playback but stops immediately. No picture.	<ul> <li>The disc may be dirty and may require cleaning.</li> <li>Ensure that the disc is installed with the label side up.</li> <li>Ensure that the equipment is connected properly.</li> <li>Ensure that the input setting for the TV is "Video".</li> <li>Check if the TV is on.</li> <li>Select the same channel and source on the TV as on the recorder.</li> </ul>
No sound.	<ul> <li>Ensure that the equipment is connected properly.</li> <li>If using a HiFi amplifier, try another sound source.</li> <li>Check the Audio Output Setting menu to make sure that Analog Output is selected.</li> </ul>
Distorted sound.	<ul><li>Ensure that the input settings for the TV and stereo system are proper.</li><li>No sound is heard during still picture (pause) or slow-motion playback.</li></ul>
No audio at Digital Output.	<ul> <li>Check the digital connections.</li> <li>Check the settings menu to make sure that the digital output is set to on.</li> <li>Check if the audio format of the selected audio language matches your receiver capabilities.</li> </ul>
Distorted picture.	<ul> <li>Check the disc for fingerprints and clean with a soft cloth, wiping from center to edge.</li> <li>Sometimes a small amount of picture distortion may appear. This is not a malfunction.</li> </ul>
Completely distorted picture or no color in picture.	• The disc format is not according to the TV-set used (PAL/NTSC).
Picture is distorted during rapid advance or rapid reverse.	• The picture will be somewhat distorted at times: this is normal.
No rapid advance (or rapid reverse) playback.	• Some discs may have sections which prohibit rapid advance (or rapid reverse).
No 4:3 (16:9) picture.	Choose the correct setup "Aspect Ratio" item which matches the TV set used.
No operations perform with the remote control.	<ul> <li>Check the batteries are installed with the correct polarities (+ and –).</li> <li>The batteries are depleted: replace them with new ones.</li> <li>Point the remote control unit at the remote control signal sensor and operate.</li> <li>Operate the remote control unit at a distance of not more than 7 meters from the remote control signal sensor.</li> <li>Remove the obstacles between the remote control unit and remote control signal sensor</li> </ul>



Troubleshooting - continued

SYMPTOM (COMMON)	REMEDY
PLAY does not start playback even when title is selected.	• This may be a result of the parental lock function that has been set. Confirm the "PARENTAL" setup.
Audio soundtrack and/or subtitle language is not the one selected at the initial settings.	• If the audio soundtrack and/or subtitle language does not exist on the disc, the language selected at the initial settings will not be seen/heard.
No subtitles.	<ul><li>Subtitles appear only with discs that contain them.</li><li>Subtitles are hidden from the TV screen. Press SUBTITLE to display the subtitles.</li></ul>
Alternative audio soundtrack (or subtitle) language available.	• An alternative language can not be selected may result of no more than one languages cannot be selected.
Angle cannot change.	• This function depends on software availability. Even if a disc has a number from angles recorded, these angles may be recorded for specific scenes only.
No sound when connecting to 5.1 Channel speaker	<ul><li>Check if the disc supports 5.1 Channel.</li><li>Check if the speaker is properly connected.</li><li>Check if the audio output setting is right.</li></ul>
No key operation (by the DVD Recorder and/or the remote control) is effective.	• Turn the unit off and then back to on. Alternatively, turn off the unit, disconnect the AC power cord and then re-connect it. (The recorder may not be operating properly due to lightning, static electricity or some other external factor.)
No picture and sound (for recorded disc)	<ul> <li>Check if the DVD Recorder and external equipment are properly connected.</li> <li>Check if the schedule recording setting is correct.</li> <li>Check if using the correct recordable disc. (DVD+RW/DVD+R)</li> <li>Check if power set to stand-by mode while using schedule recording.</li> <li>Check if the disc has been closed. (only for DVD+R disc)</li> </ul>
Distorted picture or no image	<ul> <li>Check if the TV system setting is correct.</li> <li>Check If you set output format in "Progressive Scan", then you have to set "Component" in the video output setting. The actual output format must match to the output format setting.</li> </ul>
OSD setting doesn't be executed	Some setting must be stored by pressing left button. Re-check it.
Wrong time	Reset time.


#### Handling Precautions

- Hold the disc by the edges so the surface will not be soiled with fingerprints. (A)
- Fingerprints, dirt and scratches can cause skipping and distortion.
- Do not write on the label side with a ball-point pen or other writing utensils.
- Do not use record cleaning sprays, benzine, thinner, static electricity prevention liquids or any other solvent.
- Be careful not to drop or bend the disc.
- Do not install more than 1 disc on the disc tray.
- Do not try to close the disc tray when the disc is not installed properly. (B)
- Be sure to store the disc in its exclusive case when not in use.

# If the surface is soiled (C)

Wipe gently with a soft, damp (water only) cloth. When wiping discs, always move the cloth from the center hole toward the outer edge.

(If you wipe the discs using a circular motion, circular scratches are likely to occur, which will cause noise.)

If the disc is brought from a cold to a warm environment, moisture may form on the disc  $% \left( {{{\rm{T}}_{\rm{T}}}} \right)$ 

Wipe the moisture off with a soft, dry, lint-free cloth before using the disc.

## Improper disc storage

You can damage discs if you store them in the following places:

- Areas exposed to direct sunlight
- Humid or dusty areas
- Areas directly exposed to a heat outlet or heating appliance

## Playable disc format

 HDD, DVD, DVD+RW, DVD+R, DVD-RW, DVD-R, CD-DA, Mixed CD-DA, JPEG file disc and Kodak Picture Disc.

## Recordable disc format

- HDD
- DVD+RW (Application Program)
- DVD+R

#### Maintenance

- Be sure to turn the unit off and disconnect the AC power cord before maintaining the unit.
- Wipe this unit with a dry soft cloth. If the surfaces are extremely dirty, wipe clean with a cloth which has been dipped in a weak soap-and-water solution and wrung out thoroughly, and then wipe again with a dry cloth.
- Never use alcohol, benzine, thinner, cleaning fluid or other chemicals. And do not use compressed air to remove dust.
