# SPECIAL NOTE FOR USERS IN THE U.K.

The mains lead of this product is fitted with a non-rewireable (moulded) plug incorporating a 5A fuse. Should the fuse need to be replaced, a BSI or ASTA approved BS 1362 fuse marked  $\mathfrak{P}$  or  $\mathfrak{P}$  and of the same rating as above, which is also indicated on the pin face of the plug, must be used.

Always refit the fuse cover after replacing the fuse. Never use the plug without the fuse cover fitted.

In the unlikely event of the socket outlet in your home not being compatible with the plug supplied, cut off the mains plug and fit an appropriate type.

#### DANGER:

The fuse from the cut-off plug should be removed and the cut-off plug destroyed immediately and disposed of in a safe manner.

Under no circumstances should the cut-off plug be inserted elsewhere into a 13A socket outlet, as a serious electric shock may occur.

To fit an appropriate plug to the mains lead, follow the instructions below:

#### **IMPORTANT:**

The wires in the mains lead are coloured in accordance with the following code:

# Blue: Neutral

Brown: Live

As the colours of the wires in the mains lead of this product may not correspond with the coloured markings identifying the terminals in your plug, proceed as follows:

- The wire which is coloured blue must be connected to the plug terminal which is marked N or coloured black.
- The wire which is coloured brown must be connected to the plug terminal which is marked L or coloured red. Ensure that neither the brown nor the blue wire is connected to the earth terminal in your three-pin plug.

Before replacing the plug cover make sure that:

- If the new fitted plug contains a fuse, its value is the same as that removed from the cut-off plug.
- The cord grip is clamped over the sheath of the mains lead, and not simply over the lead wires.
- IF YOU HAVE ANY DOUBT, CONSULT A QUALIFIED ELECTRICIAN.

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Thank you for your purchase of this SHARP LCD colour TV product. To ensure safety and many years of trouble-free operation of your product, please read the "Important safety precautions" carefully before using this product.

# Important safety precautions

- Cleaning Unplug the AC cord from the AC outlet before cleaning the product. Use a damp cloth to clean the product. Do not use liquid cleaners or aerosol cleaners.
- Water and moisture Do not expose to rain or moisture. Do not use the product near water, such as a bathtub, washbasin, kitchen sink, laundry tub, swimming pool and in a wet basement.
- Do not place vases or any other water-filled containers on this product. The water may spill onto the product, causing fire or electric shock.
- Stand Do not place the product on an unstable cart, stand, tripod or table. Doing so can cause
  the product to fall, resulting in serious personal injuries as well as damage to the product. Use only
  a cart, stand, tripod, bracket or table recommended by the manufacturer or sold with the product.
  When mounting the product on a wall, be sure to follow the manufacturer's instructions. Use only
  the mounting hardware recommended by the manufacturer.

# Quick start guide



- 1 To receive analogue or digital terrestrially broadcasted stations, connect the antenna cable (from the antenna/cable socket or the room/roof antenna) to the input antenna port on the back of the television. If there is good reception, an indoor antenna can also be used. If you are using an active antenna, the supply voltage (5V) must also be set. (See page 18.)
- 2 Connect the AC cord to the power port on the back of the television.
- **3** Plug the AC cord into the AC outlet.

# Setting the TV on the wall

- This TV should be mounted on the wall only with a wall mount bracket approved and available from SHARP. (See page 30.) The use of other wall mount brackets may result in an unstable installation and may cause serious injuries.
- You can ask a qualified service personnel about using an optional bracket to mount the TV to the wall.
- Installing the TV on the wall requires special skill that should only be performed by qualified service personnel. Customers should not attempt to do the work themselves. SHARP bears no responsibility for improper mounting or mounting that results in accident or injury.

# Installing batteries in the remote control

Before using the remote control, install the two (supplied) AA batteries. When the batteries become worn out or "dead", replace the batteries.

- 1 Hold in the tab on the battery cover and pull the cover towards the direction of the arrow.
- 2 Insert two AA batteries.

Place the batteries with the terminals on the batteries (+ and -) in the positions as indicated in the battery compartment.

**3** Insert the smaller tab of the battery cover into the remote control opening (1) and then press down on the cover until it clicks into place (2).

#### CAUTION:

Improper use of batteries can result in chemical leakage or explosion. Be sure to follow the instructions below.

- Do not mix different types of batteries. Different types of batteries have different characteristics.
- Do not mix old and new batteries. Mixing old and new batteries can shorten the life of new batteries or cause chemical leakage in old batteries.
- Remove batteries as soon as they have worn out. Chemicals that leak from batteries can cause a rash. If you find any chemical leakage, wipe the area clean with a cloth.
- The batteries supplied with this product may have a shorter life expectancy due to storage conditions.
- If you will not be using the remote control for an extended period of time, remove the batteries from it.
- Dispose batteries according to local requirements. Please do not use the ordinary dust bin.



# Using the remote control

To use the remote control, point it towards the remote control sensor on the front of the TV.



# About using the remote control

- Do not expose the remote control to shock.
- Do not expose the remote control to high humidity conditions or liquids.
- Do not expose the remote control to direct sunlight. The heat may cause deformations of the remote control.
- If there are objects between the remote control and the sensor, it may prevent normal operation.
- If the remote control sensor on the TV is in direct sunlight or strong lighting, the remote control may not work as expected. If you experience this, change the lighting, angle to the television, or use the remote control closer to the TV.

# Turning on the television

To turn on the TV, press  $_{\odot 1}$  on the remote control or on the TV.

#### NOTE:

 If the TV is not going to be used for a long period of time, unplug the power cord from the AC outlet to remove AC power.

# Standby mode and LED indicator

Press  $\bigcirc$  on the remote control when the TV is on.

- This will put the TV into standby mode. The image on the TV will disappear and the Or indicator on the TV will change from green to red. (See page 5.)
- Small amounts of electrical power are being used when the TV is in standby mode. To completely remove power from the TV, unplug the power cord from the AC outlet.
- There is an active standby mode and a passive standby mode.

- The TV goes into active standby mode when the digital tuner is active. (This is necessary for features such as the timer feature.)
- The TV goes into passive standby mode when the digital tuner is not active.
- When the TV is in active standby mode, it consumes more power than when the TV is in passive standby mode. See "Specifications" on page 31 for specific power consumption information.
- If you want to keep power consumption as low as possible, avoid using features that require the digital tuner to remain active while in standby mode.

The Standby/On LED has the following indications.

Off	Power is off. There is no power to the TV. (The TV is not connected to the mains plug.)
Green	The TV is on.
Red	The TV is in standby mode.

# **Other LED indicators**

See page 5 for the location of the LED indicators.

The Sleep LED indicator has the following indications.

Off	The SLEEP timer mode is set to "Off".
Red	The SLEEP timer mode is set to "On".

The OPC LED indicator has the following indications.

Off	The OPC setting is set to "Off".
Green	The OPC setting is set to "On".

# Automatic setup

The first time the TV is powered on, **Auto Install** is activated automatically. The automatic setup feature allows you to set the on-screen display language, set the country or region, and do a search for channels.

#### NOTE:

- The automatic setup feature will automatically appear only once and only the first time the TV is plugged in. However, you can change these settings at any time (see "Setup Menu" on page 16).
- Press END to exit automatic setup at any time.
- For the TV to find channels (step 3), you must have an analogue antenna cable connected properly to the TV. (See page 3.)
- 1 Press ▲/▼ to select Language, and then press ◀/► to select the desired language.
- 2 Press ▲/▼ to select **Country**, and then press ◀/► to select the desired country or region.
- To do a search for available analogue channels, press
   ▲/▼ to select Installation, and then press 
   ▲/► or OK.

The auto search begins. The TV performs a frequency scan to detect the TV channels available on the network. During the frequency scan, a TV channel with ACI (Automatic Channel Installation) information may be detected.

ACI information is teletext-based information from the channel source that describes the TV channels (including channel labels and channel numbers) available on the network.

- 4 If ACI information is detected, the ACI information will be displayed on the screen. Press ▲/▼ to select the correct region and then press MENU.
- **5** The Auto Installation will end and you are ready to watch analogue TV.

# Automatic installation (DTV)

Digital TV or Digital Video Broadcasting (DVB) is a transmission scheme. DVB typically provides more stations, clearer picture quality and other services displayed on the screen. It also allows a range of new features and services including subtitles and multiple audio tracks.

To watch DTV broadcasts, complete the following procedure to scan all available services in your area. **NOTE**:

- You cannot use any DTV features until Auto Installation has been completed.
- To complete this step, you must have a digital antenna cable connected properly to the TV. (See page 3.)
- 1 On the remote control, press **DTV**.
  - The DTV Automatic Installation displays.
- 2 Press ◀/► to select the desired country or region. Press OK. The auto search begins, using the predefined frequency channel list for the country or region. Auto Installation will end and you are ready to watch DTV.

# Selecting a channel

- 1 On the remote control, press **DTV** to choose the analogue TV mode or the DTV mode.
  - Depending on your selection, a corresponding analogue antenna cable or digital antenna cable must be properly connected to the TV. See page 3.
- 2 You can scroll through the channels using the  $P(\wedge/\vee)$  buttons. Press OK to display the programme list. Or enter the channel using the **0–9** numeric buttons.
- **3** If you are using DTV, you can use the Electronic Programme Guide (EPG) or the Electronic Service Guide (ESG). (See page 26.)

# Using external equipment

# Setting the input source

To receive audio or video from an external source, set the input source using  $\bigcirc$  on the remote control or the TV.

# Connecting audio/video equipment

The way you connect your television depends on the equipment you want to connect, the ports available on the equipment (and the TV), and the quality of the signal you want to receive.

Input and output connections are available on the rear and on the side of the TV. Refer to "Television rear and side view" on page 7 for more information.

#### NOTE:

- The following diagrams show common connection scenarios. For best results, use the highest quality connection possible.
- The cables marked with \* are commercially available items.

# Connecting a VCR or DVD (display)

Use EXT1 or EXT2 to connect a VCR, DVD player, and other audiovisual equipment that are used for display.



#### VCR

#### NOTE:

- For optimal display, set the input setting to the type of input being received. See "Input Select" on page 18.
- If you are connecting recording equipment, you must use EXT1.

# **Connecting a VCR (recording)**

Use the EXT1 to connect a VCR or other audiovisual equipment that are used for recording purposes.



#### NOTE:

 For optimal display, set the input setting to the type of input being received. See "Input Select" on page 18.

# Connecting a game console or camcorder

Connect a game console, camcorder, or similar device to any of the appropriate connections on the TV. However, we suggest using EXT3 on the side panel for convenience.

# Connecting a DVD player

Use EXT3 (side panel), EXT4, EXT6, or EXT7 to connect a DVD player or similar equipment.

# **Connecting a computer**

Use EXT5 to connect a computer. You can also use the S-Video connector in EXT3 (not shown).

# Menu operation buttons

To enter and operate the main on-screen display menus, use the following buttons on the remote control.



- DTVSwitches between analogue TV mode<br/>and digital TV mode.MENUPress to display the main menu or close<br/>the main menu.▲/▼/◀/►Press to move through the on-screen<br/>display menu, select an item on the<br/>screen, or adjust an item.
- **OK** Press to select or execute a highlighted item.
- **RETURN** Press to return to the previous menu.
- **END** Press to exit the on-screen display menu.

# **AV Mode**

#### Menu Operation: A (page 12)

The **AV Mode** setting provides pre-programmed options that adjust the picture and sound settings. The following options are available.

Dynamic	Provides a high-contrast image. Most useful when viewing sports.
Standard	For use in a normally bright room. Provides a highly defined image.
Soft	Provides a softer image.
User	The user defined setting. To use this feature, select <b>User</b> . Then manually define the video and audio settings. When you select <b>User</b> , these settings will be used.
Eco	Reduces the power consumption of the TV.

#### NOTE:

- You can also select these options by pressing AV MODE on the remote control. (See page 6.)
- Once chosen, you can still manually adjust the picture and sound settings using the available options. See "Picture adjustments" on page 13 and "General Audio Adjustments" on page 15.

# **Optical Picture Control (OPC)**

#### Menu Operation: A (page 12)

The **OPC** setting automatically adjusts the brightness of the screen to the optimal setting for the background light in the room. The OPC sensor cannot be blocked for this feature to work properly. (See page 5.)

On	The screen brightness automatically adjusts to the optimal setting for the brightness of the room.
On (Display)	The OPC setting is on. The <b>Backlight</b> <b>Brightness</b> setting is displayed on the TV during the adjustment.
Off	The screen brightness is fixed to the value set in the <b>Backlight Brightness</b> setting.

• You can also select these options by pressing **OPC** on the remote control. (See page 6.)

# **Colour Temperature**

The **Colour Temperature** setting adjusts the image to provide the best white colour in the image.

High	Adds blue tones to the image

# Using Teletext

# What is Teletext?

Teletext broadcasts pages of information and entertainment to specially equipped television sets. Your TV receives teletext signals broadcast by a TV network, and decodes them into graphical format for viewing. News, weather and sports information, stock exchange prices and programme previews are among the many services available.

# **Turning on and off Teletext**

- **1** Select a TV channel or external input source providing the teletext programme.
- **2** Press  $\equiv$  to display the teletext.
- **3** Press  $\equiv$  again to change the format of the teletext.



• If you select a programme with no teletext signal, a warning displays.

# **Time display**

You can display the time information on the screen included in the DTV and teletext broadcasts.

**1** Select a TV channel that provides teletext information.

(The teletext broadcast must include time information. The time information is automatically captured.)

**2** Press **E**.

#### NOTE:

• The time display cannot be stored once the power is turned off. When you turn on the power, perform steps 1 to 2 again.
