When carrying the product or using it while worn on your body, either use an approved accessory such as a holster or otherwise maintain a distance of 1.5

cm from the body to ensure compliance with RF exposure requirements. Note that the product may be transmitting even if you are not making a phone call.

## Safety and use.....

We recommend that you read this chapter carefully before using your phone. The manufacturer disclaims any liability for damage, which may result as a consequence of improper use or use contrary to the instructions contained herein.

#### • TRAFFIC SAFETY:

Given that studies show that using a mobile phone while driving a vehicle constitutes a real risk, even when the hands-free kit is used (car kit, headset...), drivers are requested to refrain from using their mobile when the vehicle is not parked.

When driving, do not use your phone and headphone to listen to music or to the radio. Using a headphone can be dangerous and forbidden in some areas.

When switched on, your phone emits electromagnetic waves that can interfere with the vehicle's electronic systems such as ABS anti-lock brakes or airbags. To ensure that there is no problem:

- do not place your phone on top of the dashboard or within an airbag deployment area,
- check with your car dealer or the car manufacturer to make sure that the dashboard is adequately shielded from mobile phone RF energy.

#### • CONDITIONS OF USE:

You are advised to switch off the telephone from time to time to optimise its performance.  $% \label{eq:constraint}$ 

Switch the phone off before boarding an aircraft.

Switch the phone off when you are in health care facilities, except in designated areas. As with many other types of equipment now in regular use, mobile telephones can interfere with other electrical or electronic devices, or equipment using radio frequency.

Switch the phone off when you are near gas or flammable liquids. Strictly obey all signs and instructions posted in a fuel depot, petrol station, or chemical plant, or in any potentially explosive atmosphere.

When the phone is switched on, it should be kept at least 15 cm from any medical device such as a pacemaker, a hearing aid or insulin pump, etc. In particular when using the phone, you should hold it against the ear on the opposite side to the device, if any.

To avoid hearing impairment, pick up the call before holding your phone to your ear. Also move the handset away from your ear while using the "hands-free" mode because the amplified volume might cause hearing damage.

Do not let children use the phone and/or play with the telephone and accessories without supervision.

When replacing the cover please note that your phone may contain substances that could create an allergic reaction.

Always handle your phone with care and keep it in a clean and dust-free place.

Do not allow your phone to be exposed to adverse weather or environmental conditions (moisture, humidity, rain, infiltration of liquids, dust, sea air, etc). The manufacturer's recommended operating temperature range is  $-10^\circ C$  to  $+55^\circ C$ .

At over  $55^{\circ}$ C the legibility of the phone's display may be impaired, though this is temporary and not serious.

Emergency call numbers may not be reachable on all cellular networks. You should never rely only on your phone for emergency calls.

Do not open, dismantle or attempt to repair your mobile phone yourself.

Do not drop, throw or bend your mobile phone.

Do not use the phone if the glass made screen is damaged, cracked or broken to avoid any injury.

Do not paint it.

Use only batteries, battery chargers, and accessories which are recommended by TCT Mobile Limited and its affiliates and are compatible with your phone model. TCT Mobile Limited and its affiliates disclaim any liability for damage caused by the use of other chargers or batteries.

Remember to make back-up copies or keep a written record of all important information stored in your phone.

Some people may suffer epileptic seizures or blackouts when exposed to flashing lights, or when playing video games. These seizures or blackouts may occur even if a person never had a previous seizure or blackout. THIS DEVICE MEETS INTERNATIONAL GUIDELINES FOR EXPOSURE TO RADIO WAVES.

Your mobile device is a radio transmitter and receiver. It is designed not to exceed the limits for exposure to radio waves (radio frequency electromagnetic fields) recommended by international guidelines. The guidelines were developed by an independent scientific organization (ICNIRP) and include a substantial safety margin designed to assure the safety of all persons, regardless of age and health.

The radio wave exposure guidelines use a unit of measurement known as the Specific Absorption Rate, or SAR. The SAR limit for mobile devices is 2 W/kg.

Tests for SAR are conducted using standard operating positions with the device transmitting at its highest certified power level in all tested frequency bands. The highest SAR values under the ICNIRP guidelines for this device model are:

During use, the actual SAR values for this device are usually well below the values stated above. This is because, for purposes of system efficiency and to minimize interference on the network, the operating power of your mobile device is automatically decreased when full power is not needed for the call. The lower the power output of the device, the lower its SAR value.

Body-worn SAR testing has been carried out at a separation distance of 1.5 cm. To meet RF exposure guidelines during body-worn operation, the device should be positioned at least this distance away from the body. If you are not using an approved accessory ensure that whatever product is used is free of any metal and that it positions the phone the indicated distance away from the body.

Organizations such as the World Health Organization and the US Food and Drug Administration have stated that if people are concerned and want to reduce their exposure they could use a hands-free device to keep the phone away from the head and body during phone calls, or reduce the amount of time spent on the phone.



#### I.I Keys and connectors







#### Recent apps key

- Open a list of thumbnail images of apps you've worked with recently. Touch it to open an app. Swipe it left or right to remove a thumbnail from the list.
- Touch and hold: As Menu key, touch and hold it to access Wallpaper, Manage applications and Settings.

#### Home key

• While on any application or screen, touch to return to the Home screen.

#### Back key

• Touch to go back to the previous screen, or to close a dialog box, options menu, the notification panel, etc.

These keys are visible when the screen lights up.

#### Power key

- Press: Lock the screen/Light up the screen
- Press and hold: Show the pop-up menu to select from Power off/Restart/Airplane mode/Quick start
   Press and hold: Power on
- Press and hold **Power** key and **Volume down** key to capture a screenshot.
- Press to mute the ringtone when there's an incoming call.
- Press to end the current conversation during a call.

#### Volume Keys

- · Under call mode, adjust the earpiece or headset volume.
- In Music/Video/Streaming mode, adjust the media volume.
- In general mode, adjust the ringt one volume.
- Mute the ringtone of an incoming call.
- In Camera mode, using it as the capture key allows you to take a photo and start or stop recording a video.
- Press to light up the screen when it dims during a call.

I.2.I Set-up


#### Removing or installing the back cover



#### Inserting or removing the SIM card

You must insert your SIM card to make phone calls. Please power off your phone and remove battery before inserting or removing the SIM card.





For one touch 5035D/one touch 5035E, SIMI and SIM2 are overlapping sequence. To install, place the SIM1 card with chip facing downwards and the SIM2 card with chip facing upwards. For one touch 5035X/one touch 5035Y, place the SIM card with chip facing downwards.

Make sure that it is correctly inserted. To remove the card, press gently and slide it out.



On dual SIM model, SIM1 support 2G and 3G networks, SIM2 only support 2G networks.

#### Installing or removing the battery

Please power off your phone before removing the battery.



- Insert and click the battery into place, then close the phone cover.
- Unclip the cover, then remove the battery.

#### Installing and removing the microSD card



Insert the external microSD card into the slot with the gold contact facing down. To remove the external microSD card, gently press and slide it out.

Before removing the microSD card, you should ensure the phone is off, to protect it from corruption or damage. In addition, regularly removing or inserting the SD card may cause the phone to restart.

#### Charging the battery



Connect the battery charger to your phone, then the charging icon will show on the right of status bar.

- Make sure the battery is correctly inserted before connecting the charger.
- When using your telephone for the first time, charge the battery fully (approximately 5 hours).

You are advised to fully charge the battery ( 1 ). Charging status is indicated by the percentage on screen while the phone is powered off. The percentage increases as the phone is charged.



The charging status bar will not float if your battery is extensively consumed. To reduce power consumption and energy waste, when battery is fully charged, disconnect your charger from the plug; switch off Wi-Fi, GPS, Bluetooth or background-running applications when not in use; reduce the backlight time, etc.

#### **I.2.2** Power on your phone

Hold down the **Power** key until the phone powers on, unlock your phone (Slide, PIN, password, pattern) if necessary and confirm. The Home screen is displayed.

If you do not know your PIN code or if you have forgotten it, contact your network operator. Do not leave your PIN code with your phone. Store this information in a safe place when not in use.

#### Set up your phone for the first time

The first time you power on the phone, you should set the following options:

- Touch **Get started**..., then select the phone's language.
- The device will search for service by itself. The process of activation will take a few minutes
- Select your input keyboard, then touch Next.
- Select SIM you want to use, then touch Next.
- Set your date and timezone, you can also choose Automatic time zone, then touch Next.
- Setup your Google account: Touch Set up now. If you have a Google Account, touch Sign in, then enter your user name and password. If you forget your password, you can go to http://www. google.com/ to retrieve it. If you don't own a Google Account, you are prompted to create one by touching Get an account. Touch Not now to skip to the next step.
- Touch **Next** ,then the Setup complete screen will display, touch **Finish** to confirm.

When the phone is powered on, you can connect to a Wi-Fi network, without a SIM card inserted (refer to section "6.1.2 Wi-Fi"), to sign into your Google account and to use some features.

#### **I.2.3** Power off your phone

Hold down the **Power** key until the pop-up menu appears, select **Power** off, and touch **OK** to confirm.

#### I.3 Home screen

You can bring all the items (applications, shortcuts, folders and widgets) you love or use most frequently to your Home screens for quick access. Touch the **Home** key to switch to the Home screen.

Home screen is provided in an extended format to allow more space for adding applications, shortcuts etc. Slide the Home screen horizontally left and right to get a complete view of the Home screen. The white short line at the lower part of the screen indicates which screen you are viewing.

#### I.3.I Using the touchscreen

#### Touch

To access an application, touch it with your finger.

#### Touch and Hold



Touch and hold the home screen to access the available options for setting the wallpaper.

## Drag

Place your finger on any item to drag it to another location.

#### Slide/Swipe

Slide the screen to scroll up and down the applications, images, web pages... at your convenience.

## Flick

Similar to swiping, but flicking makes it move quicker.

#### Pinch/Spread



Place your fingers of one hand on the screen surface and draw them apart or together to scale an element on the screen.

Automatically change the screen orientation from portrait to landscape by turning the phone sideways to have a better screen view.

#### I.3.2 Status bar

From status bar, you can view both phone status (to the right side) and notification information (to the left side).

#### Status icons

For dual SIM model, status icons referring to either SIM1 or SIM2 will be identified by a colour which you have defined.

#### **Notification panel**

Touch and drag down the Status bar to open the notification panel. Touch and drag up to close it. From the Notification panel, you can open items and other reminders indicated by notification icons or view wireless service information.



#### Quick settings bar

- Touch to enable/disable functions or change modes.
- Slide left and right to view more.

Touch a notification and slide it to the left to delete it.

Touch the icon  $\bowtie$  to clear all event-based notifications (other ongoing notifications will remain).

Touch the Settings icon of to access **Settings**.

Once you inserted SIM card, you can drag down the notification panel even from the locked screen.

#### 1.3.3 Search bar

The phone provides a Search function which can be used to locate information within applications, the phone or the web.



#### • Search by text

- Touch Search bar from the Home screen.
- Enter the text/phrase you want to search for.
- Touch the **Enter/Search** key on the keyboard if you want to search on the web.
- **8** Search by voice
- Touch 👤 from Search bar to display a dialog screen.
- Speak the word/phrase you want to search for. A list of search results will display for you to select from.

#### 1.3.4 Lock/Unlock your screen

To protect your phone and privacy, you can lock the phone screen by choosing slide or creating a variety of patterns, PIN or password.

To create a screen unlock pattern (refer to section "Screen lock"for detail settings)

- Drag down the notification panel and touch of to enter Settings, then touch Security/Set up screen lock/Pattern.
- Draw your own pattern.



#### To create a screen unlock PIN/Password

- Touch Settings\Security\Set up screen lock\PIN or Password.
- Set your PIN or password.

#### To lock phone screen

Press the **Power** key once to lock the screen.

#### To unlock phone screen

Press the power key once to light up the screen, draw the unlock pattern you have created or enter PIN or password to unlock the screen.

If you have chosen **Slide** as the screen lock, touch and drag down the icon to unlock the screen, and drag down the icons list to access relative applications, eg. drag down to access camera directly.



#### 1.3.5 Personalize your Home screen

#### Add

Touch the application tab  $\underbrace{\dots}$ , touch and hold an application or a widget to active the Move mode, and drag the item to any Home screen as you prefer.

While adding an application to a Home screen, drag it to the top of **App info** icon to view its detail information. If the application is downloaded, drag it to the top of **Uninstall** icon to unmount it directly.

#### Reposition

Touch and hold the item to be repositioned to activate the Move mode, drag the item to the desired position and then release. You can move items both on the Home screen and the Favorite tray. Hold the icon on the left or right edge of the screen to drag the item to another Home screen.

#### Remove

Touch and hold the item to be removed to activate the Move mode, drag the item up to the top of **Remove** icon, and release after the item turns red.

#### **Create folders**

To improve the organization of items (shortcuts or applications) on the Home screen and the Favorite tray, you can add them to a folder by stacking one item on top of another. To rename a folder, open it, touch the folder's title bar to input the new name.

#### Wallpaper customization

Touch and hold an empty area, a popup window named **Select wallpaper** from will appear, offering a range of options. **Gallery** includes pictures you have taken, cropped or downloaded. **Live wallpapers** includes a scrolling list of animated wallpapers. **Video wallpaper** includes preset videos in phone, videos stored in SD card and camera. **Wallpapers** includes all preset wallpapers in the phone. Slide left and right to locate a desired image, touch **Set wallpaper** to confirm.

#### I.3.6 Application tab

Touch 💼 on the Home screen to enter applications and widgets list.

To return to the Home screen, touch the Home key.

#### **Consult recently-used applications**

To consult recently-used applications, you can touch the **Recent apps** key. Touch a thumbnail in the window to open the related application. Touch one thumbnail and slide it to the left or right to delete it. You can also touch and hold the app and touch **Remove from list** to delete it.



#### 1.3.7 Volume adjustment

#### Using volume key

Press **Volume** key to adjust the volume. To active the vibrate mode, press the **Volume down** key until the phone vibrates. Press the **Volume down** key once more to active the silent mode.

#### **Using Settings menu**

Drag down the notification panel and touch **o** to enter Settings, then touch **Audio profiles**|**Volume** you can set the volume of media, ringtone, alarm, and etc to your preference.

#### I.4 Applications and widgets list

This list contains all pre-embedded and newly installed applications and widgets.

To access the list, touch .... from Home screens.

Touch the Home key or the Back key to return to a Home screen.

Slide left and right to view all applications and widgets. Touch **APPS** or **WIDGETS** to access the category directly. Touch the icon to access the **Play store**.

#### 2.1 Using Onscreen Keyboard


#### **Onscreen Keyboard settings**

On application list, **Settings\Language & input**, touch the **Settings** icon of on the right of **Android keyboard** a series of settings are available for your selection.

#### Adjust the Onscreen Keyboard orientation

Turn the phone sideways or upright to adjust the Onscreen Keyboard orientation. You can also adjust it by changing the settings (On application list, touch **Settings\Display\Orientation**).

#### 2.1.1 Android keyboard



To show settings key 🔯 , touch **Settings\Language & input\Android** keyboard settings, then mark **Show settings key**.

#### 2.2 Text editing

#### You can edit the text you have entered.

- Touch and hold or double-tap within the text you would like to edit.
- Drag the tabs to change the high-lighted selection.
- Options list will show as below, icons from left to right mean Select all





#### You can also insert new text

- Touch where you want to type, or touch and hold a blank space, the cursor will blink and the tab will show. Drag the tab to move the cursor.
- If you have selected any text, touch the tab to show PASTE icon which allows you to paste any text you have previously copied or replace with other text.

# **3** Phone call, Call log and Contacts.....

3. Phone .....

#### 3.1.1 Placing a call

You can easily start a call using Phone.

Touch Application tab from the Home screen and select Phone.



Enter the desired number from the keyboard directly or select a contact from Contacts or Call log by sliding or touching tabs, then touch  $\zeta_{\rm c}$  to place the call.

The number you entered can be saved to **Contacts** by touching the Menu icon **a** and touching **Add to Contacts**.

If you make a mistake, you can delete the incorrect digits by touching  $\blacksquare$  .

To hang up a call, touch **m** or the **Power** key.

#### International call

To dial an international call, touch and hold 0 to enter "+", then enter the international country prefix followed by the full phone number and finally touch  $\zeta_{i}$ .

#### **Emergency call**

If your phone has network coverage, dial emergency number and touch to make an emergency call. This works even without a SIM card and without typing the PIN code.



For dual SIM mode, the default voice call SIM card is SIMI. Touch **Settings\SIM management\Default SIM** to select the default SIM card for voice call.

#### 3.1.2 Answering or rejecting a call



When you receive a call

- Slide the icon Sightward to answer;
- Slide the icon slight leftward to reject;
- Slide the icon 🚊 upward to reject the call by sending a preset message.

To mute the incoming calls, press the **Volume up/down** key or turn the phone face down if **Turn over to mute** is activated. To activate, touch **Settings\Gestures\Turn over to mute** or touch **Phone\Settings\Other settings\Turn over to mute**.

#### 3.1.3 Calling your voicemail

Your voicemail is provided by your network to avoid missing calls. It works like an answering machine that you can consult at any time.

To access your voicemail, touch and hold 1 on Phone tab.

To set your voicemail number, touch Menu icon and touch Settings\ Call settings\Voice call\Voicemail.

If you receive a voicemail, a voicemail icon  $\Omega\Omega$  appears on the Status bar. Open the Notification panel, touch **New voicemail**.

#### 3.1.4 During a call

To adjust the volume during a call, press the Volume up/down key.

Touch Menu icon to Add a call or Start recording.

Touch to mute the current call. Touch this icon again to unmute the call.

Touch to activate the speaker during the current call. Touch this icon again to deactivate the speaker.

To avoid misoperation on touchscreen during a call, screen will be locked automatically when you put the cellphone close to your ear; and it will be unlocked when the cellphone is taken away from your ear.

#### 3.1.5 Call settings

Touch Menu icon **]** and **Settings** from Dial screen, the following options are available:

- Enable back Mark the checkbox to enable cameras can be camera switched.

- Auto drop back Mark the checkbox to active.
- Outgoing video Touch to display local video when you place a call.
- Incoming video Touch to display local video when receiving an call incoming call.

#### Internet call

For more information of Internet call, please refer to section **6.7** Configuring Internet (SIP) calling.

#### Other settings

#### • Fixed Dialing Numbers

Fixed Dialing Number (FDN) is a service mode of SIM, where outgoing calls are restricted to a set of phone numbers. These numbers are added to the FDN list. The most common practical application of FDN is for parents to restrict the phone numbers which their children can dial.

For security reasons, you'll be prompted to enable FDN by entering SIM PIN2 which is usually acquired from your service provider or SIM maker.

#### Minute reminder

Mark the check box to enable minute reminder at 50s of every minute during a call.

#### Vibrate reminder

Mark the checkbox to enable vibration when the call is connected.

#### Turn on smart calling

Mark the checkbox to turn on smart calling.

#### Power button ends call

Mark the checkbox to end a call while pressing the power button.

#### **Quick responses**

Touch to edit quick responses which will be used when you reject a call with messages.

#### 3.2 Call log

You can access your call memory by touching  $\bigcirc$  from the Dial screen. Touch  $\bigcirc$  on the right side of contact/number to place a call directly. There are three kinds of calls in Call log:

2	Missed calls
7	Outgoing calls
K I	Incoming calls

Touch icons on top of call logs to change among different kinds.

Touch a contact or number to view information or further operations.

You can view detailed information of a call, launch a new call or send messages to a contact or number, or add numbers to **People** (only available for unsaved phone numbers), etc.

Touch the photo 🕹 to open the Quick Contact panel.

To clear the entire call memory, touch Menu icon **a** and **Delete**, select the call log entries you want to delete and then touch the trash bin.



**People** app enables quick and easy access to the people you want to reach.

You can view and create contacts on your phone and synchronize these with your Gmail contacts or other applications on the web or on your phone.

#### 3.3.1 Consult your contacts

To access **People** app, touch Application tab on the Home screen, then select **People**.



Touch Menu icon it display contacts list option menu.

Following actions are enabled:

- **Delete contact** Select and delete unwanted contacts.
- Contacts to display Choose contacts to display.
- Import/Export Import or export contacts between phone, SIM card, and microSD card, or share contacts.
- Accounts Manage the synchronization settings for different accounts.
- Settings
   Touch to set display mode of contacts.
- Share visible Share contacts with others by sending the contacts contacts vCard to them via Bluetooth, Email, SMS,etc.

#### 3.3.2 Managing contact groups

The contact group helps you to improve the organization of your contacts. You can add, remove and view groups in the **Contact group** screen.

Touch the icon 🐲 to view local groups. To create a new group, touch the icon 🏨, enter the new name and touch **Done** to confirm.

#### 3.3.3 Adding a contact

Touch the icon  $\underline{\mathcal{Q}}_{1}$  in the contact list to create a new contact.

You are required to enter the contact's name and other contact information. By scrolling up and down the screen, you can move from one field to another easily.

If you want to add more information, touch  $\mbox{\bf Add}$  another field to add a new category.

When finished, touch **Done** to save.

To exit without saving, you can touch Menu icon and then touch **Discard**.

#### Add to/remove from Favourites

To add a contact to favourites, you can touch a contact to view details then touch  $\bigwedge$  to add the contact to favourites (the star will turn yellow in color).

To remove a contact from favourites, touch the white star  $\underbrace{}_{max}$  on contact details screen.

#### 3.3.4 Editing your contacts

To edit contact information, touch the Menu icon in the contact details screen, then touch **Edit**. When finished, touch **Done**.

#### Change a contact's default phone number

The default phone number (the number which has priority when making a call or sending a message) will always be displayed under the contact name.

#### Set ringtone for a contact

On the contact's detail screen, touch Menu icon to display contacts list options menu, touch **Set ringtone**.

#### Delete a contact

To delete a contact, touch Menu icon  $\begin{bmatrix} 1 \\ 0 \end{bmatrix}$  and **Delete contact** from contact (details) screen. Pick the contact you want to remove and touch  $\begin{bmatrix} 1 \\ 0 \end{bmatrix}$  to confirm. Touch  $\begin{bmatrix} 1 \\ 0 \end{bmatrix}$  to delete all contacts, touch  $\begin{bmatrix} 1 \\ 0 \end{bmatrix}$  to cancel the selected one.



The contact you have deleted will also be removed from other applications on the phone or web the next time you synchronize your phone.

#### 3.3.5 Communicating with your contacts

From the contacts list, you can communicate with your contacts by making a call or exchanging messages.

To launch a call to a contact, touch the contact to enter the detail screen, then touch the number.

To send a message to a contact, touch the contact to enter the detail screen, then touch the icon  $\blacksquare$  on the right side of the number.

#### Use Quick contact for Android

Touch a contact's picture to open Quick Contact for Android, then you can touch the number or the icon  $\blacksquare$  for the way you want to connect.



The icons available on Quick Contact panel depend on the information you have for the contact and the applications and accounts on your phone.

#### 3.3.6 Contacts importing, exporting and sharing

This phone enables you to import contacts from SIM card/microSD card and export contacts to a microSD card which can then be used to back up your information.

From Contacts screen, touch Menu icon **1** to open options menu, touch **Import/Export**, then select Phone, Phone storage, SD Card, SIM/USIM card, and other accounts (eg: gmail account).

To import/export a single contact from/to SIM card, choose an account and target SIM card(s), select the contact you want to import/export, and touch the icon  $\sqrt{}$  to confirm.

To import/export all contacts from/to SIM card, choose an account  $% T_{\rm exp}(s)$  and target SIM card(s), select  $\swarrow$  and touch the icon  $\sqrt{}$  to confirm.

You can share a single contact or contacts with others by sending the contact's vCard to them via Bluetooth, Gmail, etc.

Touch a contact you want to share, touch Menu icon **a** and **Share** from contact details screen, then select the application to perform this action.

#### 3.3.7 Displaying contacts

You can configure which group of contacts, for each account, you want to display in the Contacts list. Touch Menu icon and touch **Contacts to display** from contacts list screen, then you can choose contacts to display.

Touch Menu icon **and Settings**, you can sort list by Given name or Family name, as well as view contact names as first/last name first.

#### 3.3.8 Joining/Separating contacts

To avoid duplication, you can add any new contact information to existing contacts in a single action.

Touch the contact which you want to add information to, touch Menu icon and touch **Edit contact**, then touch Menu icon again and touch **Join**.

At this time, you are required to select the contact whose information you want to join with the first contact. The information from the second contact is added to the first one, and the second contact will no longer be displayed in the Contacts list.

To separate contact information, touch the contact whose information you want to separate, touch Menu icon and touch **Edit contact**, then touch Menu icon again and touch **Separate**, touch **OK** to confirm.

#### 3.3.9 Accounts

Contacts, data or other information can be synchronized from multiple accounts, depending on the applications installed on your phone.

To add an account, drag down the notification panel and touch of to enter **Settings**, then touch **Add account**.

You are required to select the kind of account you are adding, like Google, Corporate, etc.

As with other account set-ups, you need to enter detailed information, like username, password, etc.

You can remove an account to delete it and all associated information from the phone.Open the **Settings** screen, touch the account you want to delete, touch the Menu icon and **Remove account**, then confirm.

#### Turn on/off the sync & Auto-sync

Touch an account to enter the account screen, mark/unmark the checkbox(s) to turn on/off the account's auto-sync. When activated, all changes to information on the phone or online will be automatically synchronized to each other.

#### Sync manually

You can also synchronize an account manually on **Account** screen, touch an account in the list, then touch Menu icon **and Sync now**.

# **4** Messaging, Email .....

### 4.1 Messaging.....

You can create, edit and receive SMS and MMS with this mobile phone.

To access this feature, touch Application tab from the Home screen, then select **Messaging**.

All messages you receive or send out can be saved in phone memory or SIM card. Touch **Menu** key from Messaging screen, then touch **Setting\Text message (SMS)\SMS storage location** to select where to save the messages. To consult messages stored in SIM card, touch Menu icon from Messaging screen, then touch **Settings\Manage SIM messages**.

#### 4.1.1 Write message

On message list screen, touch the new message icon  $\square$  to write text/ multimedia messages.

An SMS will be converted to MMS automatically when media files (image, video, audio, slides, etc.) are attached or subject or email addresses are added. To send a multimedia message, enter the recipient's phone number in the

To bar, touch Type to compose bar to enter the text of the message. touch Menu icon to open the option menu, touch Add subject to

MMS enables you to send video clips, images, photos, animations, slides

and sounds to other compatible mobiles and e-mail addresses.

Specific letters (accent) will increase the size of the SMS, which ର୍ଚ୍ଚ may cause multiple SMS to be sent to your recipient.

An SMS message of more than 160 characters will be charged as several SMS. When the total number of characters you have entered is approaching the 160-character limit, a counter will appear on the lower right corner below Send option of the text box to remind you how many characters are allowed to be entered in one message.

Enter the mobile phone number of the recipient on **To** bar or touch to add recipients, touch Type to compose bar to enter the text of the message. When finished, touch  $\searrow$  to send the text message. You can select a default SIM card or set always ask mode for messaging if two cards are inserted.



Enter Edit slide show screen, touch Add slide to create a new slide, and touch currently existing slide to edit it (see following picture). Touch Menu icon to get more actions, like setting the slide duration, add music, etc.

- Access **People** application to select one or more contact(s) to attach.
- Calendar Enter Calendar to select events to attaching.





#### 4.1.2 Manage messages

When receiving a message, an icon  $\bigcirc$  will appear on status bar as notification. Drag down the status bar to open the Notification panel, touch the new message to open and read it. You can also access the Messaging application and touch the message to open.

Messages are displayed in conversational order.

To reply to a message, touch the current message to enter message composing screen, enter the text, then touch  $\triangleright$ .

Touch and hold a SMS in message details screen. The following message options are available for selection:

- Copy message text This option displays when the message is an SMS. Copy the current message content. You can paste it to the enter bar of the new message you are going to compose.
- Save message to This option displays when the message is an SMS. SIM card Touch to save the message to SIM card.
- Forward Touch to forward the message to another recipient.
- Lock/Unlock message
   Touch to lock/unlock the message so it can't/ can be deleted if you reach maximum number of stored messages.
- View message Touch to view details of the message. details
- Delete message Delete the current message.
- Select text Select the current message.

#### 4.1.3 Adjust message settings

You can adjust a set of message settings. From Messaging application screen, touch Menu icon and touch Settings.

#### **Alphabet** management

Touch to set Alphabet management mode.

#### Storage

<ul> <li>Delete old messages</li> </ul>	Select to delete old messages when the maximum number of stored messages is reached.
<ul> <li>Text message limit</li> </ul>	Touch to set the number of text messages to be saved per conversation.
<ul> <li>Multimedia message limit</li> </ul>	Touch to set the number of multimedia messages to be saved per conversation.

#### Text (SMS) Messages

- Delivery reports Select to request a delivery report for each text message you send. Manage SIM Touch to manage the messages stored on SIM messages card. Edit guick text Touch to add or edit message templates. SMS service Touch to view or edit SMS service centre centre number.
- Validity period Select message validity period such as Maximum, Lhour, 6 hours etc.
- SMS storage Touch to select phone or SIM card to store location messages.

#### Multimedia (MMS) Messages

retrieve

- Select to request a delivery report for each Delivery reports multimedia message you send.
- Read reports Select to request a report on whether each recipient has read a multimedia message sent by you.
- Send read report Select to request a report on whether the multimedia message is sent out.
- Auto-retrieve Select to download the full MMS message (including message body and attachment) automatically to your phone. Otherwise, download only the MMS message header.
- Select to download the full MMS message (including Roaming automessage body and attachment) automatically when roaming. Otherwise, download only the MMS message header to avoid extra charges.
- Creation mode Select creation mode as restricted, warning or free
- Maximum Select to edit the message size, but it should not be more than 300KB. message size
- Priority Select message priority as high, normal or low.

#### Cell Broadcast

- Enable CB Select to enable CB ringtone.
- Select CB Touch to select a ringtone as a CB notification ringtone tone.
- Cell Broadcast Touch to choose a SIM card and configure cell broadcast messages.

#### Notifications

- Notifications Select to display message notifications in status bar.
- Select ringtone Touch to select a ringtone as a new message notification tone.

#### Service message setting

- Enable service Select the checkbox to enable to receive service message message.
- Show animation Touch to show animation of operation prompt.

#### 4.2 Gmail/Email

The first time you set up your phone, you can select to use an existing Gmail or to create a new Email account.

#### 4.2.1 Gmail .....

As Google's web-based email service, Gmail is configured when you first set up your phone. Gmail on your phone can be automatically synchronized with your Gmail account on the web. Unlike other kinds of email account, each message and its replies in Gmail are grouped in your inbox as a single conversation; all emails are organized by labels instead of folders.

#### To access Gmail

From the Home screen, touch the Application tab to enter the applications list, then touch **Gmail**.

Gmail displays messages and conversations from one single Gmail account at a time, if you own more than one account, you can add a new one by touching Menu icon and Settings from Inbox screen, then touch ADD ACCOUNT. When finished, you can switch accounts by touching the account name from Inbox screen, and touch the account you want to view.

#### To create and send emails

- Touch the icon 
   <u>from Inbox screen.</u>
- Enter recipient(s)'s email address in **To** field, and if necessary, touch Menu icon and touch **Add Cc/Bcc** to add a copy or a blind copy to the message.
- Enter the subject and the content of the message.
- Touch Menu icon and select to add an attachment.
- Finally, touch the icon > to send.
- If you do not want to send the mail out right away, you can touch Menu icon and Save draft or touch Back key to save a copy. To view the draft, touch the icon , then select Drafts.

If you do not want to send or save the mail, you can touch Menu icon and then touch **Discard**.

To add a signature to emails, touch Menu icon and **Settings** from inbox screen, choose an account, then touch **Signature**.

#### To receive and read your emails

When a new email arrives, you will be notified by a ringtone or vibration, and an icon will appear on Status bar.

Touch and drag down the Status bar to display the Notification panel, touch the new email to view it. Or you can also access the Gmail Inbox label and touch the new mail to read it.

You can search for an email by sender, subject, label, etc.

- Touch the icon Q from Inbox screen.
- Enter the keyword you want to search for in the searching box and touch the Enter key in the software keyboard.

#### To reply or forward emails

When viewing an email, you will see three icons offering further options at the centre of the conversation.

- Reply/Reply all Touch to enter text-inputting mode, enter the message you want to reply, then touch icon > to send this message to one single recipient or all people in a mail loop.
- Touch to forward the message to another person. Forward You are required to enter the new recipient's email address and then touch >.

#### Managing Gmails by Labels

To conveniently manage conversations and messages, you can organize them using a Label.

To label a conversation when reading a conversation's messages, touch the icon  $\mathcal{A}$  and select the label to assign to the conversation.

To view conversations by labels when viewing your inbox or another conversation list, touch the icon  $\mathcal{Q}$ , then touch a label to view a list of conversations with that label.

To manage labels, touch MANAGE LABELS from Labels screen.

Mark the checkbox to select email to activate batch mode, and produce the following options:

• 💽	Touch to archive the email message.
• 🝵	Touch to delete the email message.
. 🦚	Touch to add or change the label of the email message or conversation.

#### **G**mail settings

To manage Gmail settings, touch Menu icon **and Settings** in Inbox screen.

#### **General settings**

- Confirm before Mark the checkbox to confirm before deleting emails.
- Confirm before Mark the checkbox to confirm before archiving emails.
- Confirm before Mark the checkbox to confirm before sending emails.
- Reply all Touch to mark the checkbox to make the default responding to messages.
- Auto-fit messages Mark the checkbox to shrink messages to fit the screen and allow zooming.
- Auto-advance Touch to select which screen to show after you delete or archive a conversation.

Mark the checkbox to hide checkboxes while selecting emails in the batch mode.

Touch to show/hide message actions.

Touch to remove the search history.

Touch to hide pictures for all senders.

- Hide checkboxes
- Message Actions
- Clear search history
- Hide pictures in messages

Touch an account, the following settings will show:

- **Priority Inbox** To set this inbox as the default one.
- Notifications Select to activate notification when a new email arrives.
- Sound & vibrate Touch to set Ringtone, Vibrate and Notify once.
- Signature To add a signature text to the end of each mail you send.
- Gmail sync is ON Touch to turn on/off Gmail sync.
- Days of mail to sync
- Manage labels
- Touch to open the Label screen, where you can manage synchronization and notifications.

Touch to set the duration of days for mail sync.

- Download Mark the checkbox to auto download attachments to recent messages via Wi-Fi.
- 4.2.2 Email.....

Besides your Gmail account, you can also set-up external POP3 or IMAP email accounts in your phone.

To access this function, touch Application tab from the Home screen, then select **Email**.

An email wizard will guide you through the steps to set-up an email account.  $% \left( {{{\left[ {{{\left[ {{{\left[ {{{c_{1}}} \right]}}} \right]}_{\rm{count}}}}} \right]_{\rm{count}}} \right)$ 

• Enter the email address and password of the account you want to setup.

- Touch Next. If the account you entered is not provided by your service provider in the phone, you will be prompted to go to the email account settings screen to enter settings manually. Or you can touch Manual setup to directly enter the incoming and outgoing settings for the email account you are setting up.
- · Enter the account name and display name in outgoing emails.
- To add another email account, you can touch Menu icon and **Settings**. Touch **Add account** on the right of the title to create.

#### To create and send emails

- Touch the icon 🖂 from Inbox screen.
- Enter recipient(s) email address(es) in To field.
- If necessary, touch Menu icon and touch Add Cc/Bcc to add a copy or a blind copy to the message.
- Enter the subject and the content of the message.
- Touch Menu icon , touch **Attach file** to add an attachment.
- Finally, touch **> to send.**

If you do not want to send the mail right away, you can touch Menu icon
 and Save draft or touch Back key to save a copy.

4.3 Google Talk......talk

Google's instant messaging service, Google Talk, lets you communicate with your friends whenever they are connected to this service.

To access this feature and sign in, touch Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Talk**. All friends added by using Google Talk from the web or phone will be displayed in your friends list.

Touch your account to set your online status.

Touch the text box below your online status to enter your status message.

To sign out, touch Menu icon from Friends list to display options, then touch **Sign out**. Or you can also select **Sign out** from online status.

#### 4.3.1 Chatting with your friends

To start a chat, touch the name of a friend in your Friends list, then enter your message and finally touch >.

You can invite other friends to join in a group chat by touching Menu icon and **Add to chat** and then selecting the friend you want to add.

#### 4.3.2 To add a new friend

From Friends list, touch the icon 2, to add a new friend. Enter the Google Talk ID or Gmail address of the friend you want to add, and then touch **Done**.

A notification with this invitation will be received by the friend. By touching the invitation, the friend can select **Block**, **Decline** or **Accept** in response.

#### 4.3.3 To close a chat

When you want to end a chat, touch Menu icon from Chatting screen directly, and then touch **End chat**.

If you want to end all chats, touch Menu icon and **End all chats** from Friends list screen.

#### 4.3.4 To manage your friends

Besides adding new friends to your friends list, the following actions are available for your choice:

• To view all friends/ By default, only friends that you frequently most popular friends list. To view all friends, touch Menu icon and Display options, then touch Name. To return to displaying most popular friends screen, touch Availability or Recency from Display options.

#### To block/Remove a friend

To block a friend from exchanging messages or remove them from your friends list, touch Menu icon and Friend info from Chatting screen, then touch **Block** or **Remove**. All blocked friends can be viewed by touching Menu icon and **Settings**, touch an account then choose **Blocked friends**. To unblock a friend, touch the name of this friend and touch **OK** when prompted.

#### 4.3.5 Settings

A series of settings are available for your selection by touching Menu icon and **Settings** from Friends list screen, and choose an account.

- Mobile indicator Select to display an indicator icon along with your name in other people's Friends list.
- Away when screen Select to set status as Away when the screen is off turned off.
- Invitation Select to activate the notification function on notifications status bar when a new message arrives.
- IM/Video chat Touch to set the notification way for text or Nideo chat.
- Notification/Video Touch to choose a ringtone for notification or chat ringtone Video chat.
- Vibrate Touch to set the vibrate way for text or Video chat.
- Blocked friends Touch to show/unblock blocked friends.
- Clear search Touch to clear previous chat search history from history showing up in the Search box.
- Manage account Touch to add, remove or sync your accounts.
- Terms & privacy Touch to show more information about Talk.

## 5 Calendar & Alarm clock & Calculator.....

Use Calendar to keep track of important meetings, appointments, etc.

To access this function, touch Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Calendar**.

#### 5.1.1 Multimode view

You can display the Calendar in daily, weekly, monthly, or agenda view.

Touch the date to change your Calendar view, and a drop-down menu will show for you to choose. Touch the icon 📷 to return to Today's view.



#### 5.1.2 To create new events

You can add new events from any Calendar view.

- In portrait mode, touch Menu icon and New event from Calendar screen; or in landscape mode, touch the icon to access new event edit screen.
- Fill in all required information for this new event. If it is a whole-day event, you can select **All day**.
- Invite guests to the event. Enter the email addresses of the guests you want to invite with commas to separate. The guests will receive an invitation from Calendar and Email.
- When finished, touch **DONE** from the top of the screen.

To quickly create an event from Day, Week view screen, touch and hold an empty spot or an event to open Option menu, then touch **New event** to enter the event details screen of the time you have previously selected. Or you can also touch the empty spot to select the target area which will turn blue, and tap again to create the new event.

#### 5.1.3 To delete or edit an event

To share, delete or edit an event, touch the event to enter details screen, touch the icon  $\approx$  to share the event to other people by Bluetooth, Email and messaging, etc., touch the icon  $\swarrow$  to edit the event, and touch the icon  $\boxed{100}$  to delete.

#### 5.1.4 Event reminder

If a reminder is set for an event, the upcoming event icon **T** will appear on Status bar as a notification when the reminder time arrives. Touch and drag down the status bar to open the notification panel, touch event name to view Calendar notification list.

Touch **Snooze all** to turn off all event reminders for 5 minutes.

Touch **Dismiss all** to delete all reminders from the list.

Touch  $\mbox{\bf Back}$  key to keep the reminders pending in the status bar and the notification panel.

Important options by touching Menu icon 🚦 from Calendar main screen:

New event	To add a new event
Refresh	To refresh the calendar
• Search	To search in the calendar
• Calendars to display	To show or hide, remove or add calendars
Clear events	To clear events in the calendar.
• Settings	To set a series of Calendar settings

Your mobile phone has a built-in clock.

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Clock**.

Touch anywhere of the screen to dim/light the screen. Touch O Set alarm to add or set an alarm.

#### 5.2.1 To set an alarm

From **Clock** screen, touch  $\bigotimes$  to enter **Alarms** screen, touch + to add a new alarm. Following options will show:

- Enable alarm Touch to enable the alarm.
- Time Touch to set time.
- **Repeat** Touch to select days you want alarm to work
- Ringtone Touch to select a ringtone for the alarm
- Vibrate Select to activate vibration
- Label Touch to set a name for the alarm
- Crazy alarm Touch to set an alarm without snooze mode, the alarm will keep work until you press dismiss button.

When finished, touch **DONE** to confirm.

To delete an alarm, touch it from **Alarms** screen to enter the alarm editing screen, touch **(b)** to delete. Touch **OK** to confirm, touch **Cancel** to cancel.

#### 5.2.2 To adjust alarm settings

Touch Menu icon **a** from **Alarms** screen, then touch **Settings**. The following options can now be adjusted:

- Alarm in silent Select to play alarm with sound or vibration even when the phone is in Silent mode
- Alarm volume Touch to set the volume of alarms
- **Snooze duration** Touch to set temporary turn off time of an alarm
- Volume button
   Touch to set side Volume up/down key
   behaviors when alarm sounds: None, Snooze
   or Dismiss
- Set default ringtone Touch to set default ringtone for alarms
- Turn over to Select to turn on/off snooze mode. activate
- View Whether and Events Mark the checkbox to display weather forecast and today's event.

## 5.3 Calculator.....




With Calculator, you can solve many mathematical problems.

To access this function, touch Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Calculator**.

There are two panels available: Basic panel and Advanced panel.

To switch between panels, select one of the following two ways:

- Touch and drag the basic screen to the left to open the Advanced panel.
- Or touch and hold the Menu key from basic panel to open option menu and touch **Advanced panel**.



Enter a number and the arithmetic operation to be performed, enter the second number, then touch "=" to display the result. Touch  $\bigcirc$  to delete digits one by one, touch and hold  $\bigcirc$  to delete all at one time.

When some numbers or operations have been entered, touch and hold the entering bar to open a menu offering these further operations:

- Cut To cut selected text
- Copy To copy selected text
- Paste <sup>(1)</sup> To paste what you have previously copied to the entering bar

<sup>(1)</sup> Option will not appear unless copy or cut operation has been made.

# 6 Getting connected.....

To connect to the internet with this phone, you can use GPRS/EDGE/3G networks or Wi-Fi, whichever is most convenient.

## 6.1 Connecting to the Internet

### 6.1.1 GPRS/EDGE/3G

The first time you turn on your phone with SIM card inserted, it will automatically configure network service: GPRS, EDGE or 3G. If the network is not connected, you can press and hold <sup>11</sup>/<sub>4</sub> on notification panel.

To check the network connection you are using, drag down notification panel and touch of to access Settings, then touch More...\Mobile networks\Mobile network settings\Access Point Names or Network operators.

#### To create a new access point

A new GPRS/EDGE/3G network connection can be added to your phone with the following steps:

- Drag down notification panel and touch 🔯 to access Settings.
- Touch More...\Mobile networks\Mobile network settings\Access Point Names
- Then touch Menu icon again and touch New APN.
- Enter the required APN information.
- When finished, touch Menu icon and touch **Save**.

#### To activate/deactivate Data roaming

When roaming, you can decide to connect/disconnect to a data service.

- Drag down notification panel and touch 🔯 to access Settings.
- SIM management\Roaming.
- Mark/Unmark the **Data roaming** checkbox to activate or deactivate data roaming.
- When Data roaming is deactivated, you can still perform data exchange with a Wi-Fi connection (refer to "**6.1.2 Wi-Fi**").

#### 6.1.2 Wi-Fi

Using Wi-Fi, you can connect to the Internet when your phone is within range of a wireless network. Wi-Fi can be used on your phone even without a SIM card inserted.

#### To turn Wi-Fi on and connect to a wireless network

- Drag down notification panel and touch 🔯 to access Settings.
- Touch the switch off beside Wi-Fi to turn on/off Wi-Fi.
- Touch **Wi-Fi**, the detailed information of detected Wi-Fi networks is displayed in the Wi-Fi networks section.
- Touch a Wi-Fi network to connect. If the network you selected is secured, you are required to enter a password or other credentials (you may contact your network operator for details). When finished, touch **Connect**.

#### To activate notification when a new network is detected

When Wi-Fi is on and the network notification is activated, the Wi-Fi icon will appear on the status bar whenever the phone detects an available wireless network within range. The following steps activate the notification function when Wi-Fi is on:

- Drag down notification panel and touch on to access Settings.
- Touch Wi-Fi. Then touch Menu icon **and Advanced** from Wi-Fi screen.
- Mark/Unmark the **Network notification** checkbox to activate/ deactivate this function.

#### To add a Wi-Fi network

When Wi-Fi is on, you may add new Wi-Fi networks according to your preference.

- Drag down notification panel and touch 🔯 to access Settings.
- Touch Wi-Fi, and then touch + to add network.
- Enter the name of the network and any required network information.
- Touch Save.

When successfully connected, your phone will be connected automatically the next time you are within range of this network.

#### To forget a Wi-Fi network

The following steps prevent automatic connections to networks which you no longer wish to use.

- Turn on Wi-Fi, if it's not already on.
- In the Wi-Fi screen, touch & hold the name of the saved network.
- Touch Forget network in the dialog that opens.

## 6.2 Browser.....

Using Browser, you can enjoy surfing the Web.

To access this function, touch Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Browser.** 

#### To go to a web page

On Browser screen, touch the URL bar at the top, enter the address of the web page.



The URL bar will hide after a few seconds. To show the URL bar, you can touch and slide down the screen.

#### To set homepage

- Touch Menu icon from Browser screen to display option menu, touch **Settings\General\Set home page**.
- · Choose a page or most visited website as your homepage.
- If you choose Other, enter the URL of the website you want to set as your homepage, touch OK to confirm.

#### 6.2.1 Viewing web pages

When opening a website, you can navigate on web pages by sliding your finger on the screen in any direction to locate the information you want to view.

#### To zoom in/out of a web page

Pinch/Spread your finger on the screen to zoom out/in of the web page.

To quickly zoom into a section of a web page, double-tap on the section you want to view. To return to normal zoom level, double-tap again.

#### To find text on a web page

- Touch Menu icon **a** from web page screen, then touch **Find on page**.
- Enter the text or phrase you want to find.
- The first word with matching characters will be highlighted on the screen, and subsequent matches will be boxed.
- Touch the up or down arrow to switch to the previous or next matching items.
- When finished, you can touch vor the **Back** key to close the search bar.

#### Further operations for the text on a web page

You can copy, share or search the text from a web page:

- Touch and hold the text to highlight the text.
- Move the two tabs to select the text.
- Touch SELECT ALL to select all words in this web screen.
- Touch to show further actions, including copy, share and search on the page or the web.
- When finished, touch 🗸 or the **Back** key to deactivate the mode.

#### To open a new window/switch between windows

Multiple windows can be opened at the same time for your convenience.

- Touch at open all windows' thumbnails.
- · Slide up and down to view all windows, touch one to view it.
- Touch 🕂 to open a new window.
- Touch Menu icon and **New incognito tab** to open a window without any trace.
- To close a window, touch 🗙 on the window you want to close or slide it sideways.

#### **Other options:**

Close

- **Refresh** To refresh the current page.
- Forward To forward the pages you have opened.
- **Stop** To stop opening the current page.
- Home page To get back to the homepage you set.
- Save to To add the current website page as bookmark. bookmarks
  - To close all tabs and exit.
- Save for To save the web page for offline reading. You can find it offline reading via Menu icon then touch Bookmarks\History.
- Share page To share the current page with your friends via various ways, like Message, Email, Bluetooth, etc.
- Find on page To input contents you want to find on the current page.
- Request To enable/disable computer version websites. desktop site
- Bookmarks/ To see the bookmarks and browsing history. History
- Version To see the version of browser.

#### To view items you have downloaded, touch the Application tab, then touch the application **Downloads**.

To download an item, touch the item or the link you want to download. To cancel a download, touch the downloaded item from the Notification

## To download a web application/view your downloads

Touch SAVED PAGES to view the pages you saved.

#### 6.2.3 Settings

A series of settings are available for your adjustment. To access Browser settings, touch Menu icon **F** from Browser screen, and touch **Settings**.

- Open pages Mark the checkbox to open web pages zoomed in overview out, in an overview.
- Auto-fit pages Mark to format web pages to fit the screen.
- Block pop-up Mark the checkbox to prevent pop-up windows. windows

- Text encoding
- Touch to select the character-encoding standard.
- Reset to default Touch to clear all browser data and to reset all settings to default.

#### **Bandwidth management**

- Search result Touch to enable/disable browser to preload preloading search results in the background.
- Web page Touch to enable/disable browser to preload the preloading linked web pages in the background.
- Load images Mark to display images on web pages.
- Labs
- Quick controls Mark to enable quick controls.
- Fullscreen Mark to use the fullscreen mode.

## 6.3 Connecting to Bluetooth devices <sup>(1)</sup>

Bluetooth is a short-range wireless communication technology that you can use to exchange data, or connect to other Bluetooth devices for various uses.

To access this function, drag down notification panel and touch of to access **Settings**. Then touch **Bluetooth**, your device and other available ones will show on the screen.

#### To turn on Bluetooth

- Drag down notification panel and touch 🔯 to access **Settings**.
- Touch off to activate/deactivate this function.
- (I) You are recommended to use ALCATEL ONE TOUCH Bluetooth headsets, which have been tested and proved compatible with phone. You can go to www.alcatelonetouch.com for more information about ALCATEL ONE TOUCH Bluetooth headset.

To make your phone more recognizable, you can change your phone name which is visible to others.

- Drag down notification panel and touch 🔯 to access **Settings**.
- Touch Bluetooth.
- Touch Menu icon and **Rename phone**.
- Enter a name, and touch Rename to confirm.

#### To make device visible

- Drag down notification panel and touch 🔯 to access Settings.
- Touch Bluetooth
- Touch your device to make it visible or invisible.
- Touch Menu icon and **Visibility timeout** to select the visible time.

#### To pair/connect your phone with a Bluetooth device

To exchange data with another device, you need to turn Bluetooth on and pair your phone with the Bluetooth device with which you want to exchange data.

- Drag down notification panel and touch 🔯 to access **Settings**.
- Touch Bluetooth
- Touch SEARCH FOR DEVICES
- Touch a Bluetooth device you want to be paired with in the list.
- A dialog will popup, touch **Pair** to confirm.
- If the pairing is successful, your phone connects to the device.

#### To disconnect/unpair from a Bluetooth device

- Touch the Settings icon  $\mathbf{I}$  beside the device you want to unpair.
- Touch Unpair to confirm.

## 6.4 Connecting to a computer

With the USB cable, you can transfer media files and other files between your microSD card/phone's internal storage and the computer. Before using this MTP, you should firstly unmark **USB debugging** via **Settings\ About phone\Advanced settings\USB debugging**.

#### To connect your phone to the computer:

- Use the USB cable that came with your phone to connect the phone to a USB port on your computer. You will receive a notification that the USB is connected.
- Your phone will automatically be connected as a media device to transfer files.



Before using MTP, make sure that the driver (Windows Media Player 11 or above version) has been installed.

#### To format a microSD card

- Drag down notification panel and touch 🔯 to access Settings.
- Touch Storage.
- Touch **Format SD card**. On the screen a popup warns you that formatting the microSD card will erase its contents, touch **Format SD card**.

## 6.5 Sharing your phone's mobile data connection

You can share your phone's mobile data connection with a single computer via a USB cable(USB tethering) or with up to eight devices at once by turning your phone into a portable Wi-Fi hotspot.

The functions below may incur additional network charges from your network operator. Extra fees may also be charged in roaming areas.

#### To share your phone's data connection via USB

Use the USB cable that along with your phone to connect the phone to a USB port on your computer.

- Drag down notification panel and touch 🔯 to access **Settings**.
- Touch More...\Tethering & portable hotspot.
- $\bullet$  Mark\unmark the checkbox of USB tethering to activate/deactivate this function.

## To share your phone's data connection as a portable Wi-Fi hotspot

- Drag down notification panel and touch 🔯 to access **Settings**.
- Touch More...\Tethering & portable hotspot.
- Mark\unmark the checkbox of **Portable Wi-Fi hotspot** to activate/ deactivate this function.

#### To rename or secure your portable hotspot

When Portable Wi-Fi hotspot is activated, you could change the name of your phone's Wi-Fi network (SSID) and secure its Wi-Fi network.

- Drag down notification panel and touch 🔯 to access Settings.
- Touch More...\Tethering & portable hotspot.
- Touch **Set up Wi-Fi hotspot** to change the network SSID or set your network security.
- Touch Save.

## 6.6 Connecting to virtual private networks

Virtual private networks (VPNs) allow you to connect to the resources inside a secured local network from outside network. VPNs are commonly deployed by corporations, schools, and other institutions so that their users can access local network resources when not inside that network, or when connected to a wireless network.

#### To add a VPN

- Drag down notification panel and touch 🔯 to access Settings.
- Touch More...\VPN settings\Add VPN profile
- In the screen that opens, follow the instructions from your network administrator to configure each component of the VPN settings.
- Touch Save.

The VPN is added to the list on the VPN settings screen.



Before adding a VPN, you should set a PIN code or password for your phone.

#### To connect/disconnect to a VPN

To connect to a VPN:

- Drag down notification panel and touch 🔯 to access Settings.
- Touch More...\VPN settings
- VPNs you have added are listed; touch the VPN you want to connect with.
- In the dialog that opens, enter any requested credentials and touch **Connect**.

To disconnect:

• Open the Notification panel and touch the resulting notification for the VPN disconnection.

#### To edit/delete a VPN

To edit a VPN:

- Drag down notification panel and touch 🔯 to access Settings.
- Touch More...\VPN settings
- VPNs you have added are listed; touch & hold the VPN you want to edit.
- Touch Edit profile.
- After finished, touch Save.

#### To delete:

- Touch and hold the VPN you want to delete, in the dialog that opens, touch **Delete profile**.
- Touch **OK** to confirm.

## 6.7 Configuring Internet (SIP) calling

You can place/receive voice calls via the Internet when connected to a Wi-Fi network, rather than via your mobile network. You should configure a valid internet account before using this feature. Refer to section **3.1.1 Placing a call** to learn more about placing an internet call.

#### To add an internet calling account

- Touch the Application tab from the Home screen and then select **Phone**.
- Touch and then touch Settings\Internet call\Use Internet call.
- Mark the checkbox to enable Internet calling.
- Touch Accounts, then touch ADD ACCOUNT tab.
- In the screen that opens, follow the instructions from your internet calling service provider to configure the settings for your account.
- When finished, touch **SAVE** to confirm or touch **DISCARD** to cancel.

#### To edit/remove an internet calling account

#### To edit:

- Touch the Application tab from the Home screen and then select **Phone**.
- Touch and then touch Settings\Internet call\Accounts.
- Accounts you have added are listed; touch the account you want to edit.
- Edit your chosen settings. When finished, touch SAVE.

#### To remove:

- Touch the account you want to remove.
- Touch and touch Remove account.

#### To configure your phone to receive Internet calls

Receiving Internet incoming calls is off by default to reduce power consumption.  $% \left( {{{\left( {{{{\bf{n}}_{{\rm{c}}}}} \right)}_{{\rm{c}}}}} \right)$ 

- Touch the Application tab from the Home screen and then select **Phone**.
- Touch Settings\Internet call\Accounts\Receive incoming calls.
- Mark/Unmark the checkbox to activate/deactivate this function.

# **7** Play Store <sup>(1)</sup>......

Play Store is an online software store, where you can download and install applications and games to your Android Powered Phone.

To open Play Store:

- Touch Application tab from the Home screen, then touch Play Store.
- For the first time you access Play Store, a screen with terms of service pops up for your attention, touch **Accept** to continue.

Touch Menu icon **B**, then touch **Help** to enter Play Store help page for more information on this function.

# 7.1 Locate the item you want to download and install

Play Store home page provides several ways to find applications. It showcases applications and games in categorized listings.

Touch Menu icon and My Apps to see all your downloads.



Touch a category on Play Store screen to browse its contents. You can also select a subcategory if there is any. Within each category you can select to view items sorted by Top paid, Top free, Top grossing, etc



Touch the Play Store icon 👕 on the top left of the screen or touch **Back** key to return to the previous screen.

## 7.2 Download and install

#### To download & install:

- Navigate to the item you want to download, and select to enter the details screen from which you can read its description, overall rating or comments, view developer's information, etc.
- Touch **Install** to preview the functions and data the application can access on your phone if you install it.
- Touch Accept & download.
- The progress of the download will show on the details screen, touch to stop downloading the item. You can also access this screen through Notification panel.
- After download and installation have finished, you will see a notification icon  $\underline{\mathbf{4}}$  on the status bar.

<sup>(1)</sup> Depending on your country and operator.



Be especially cautious with applications that have access to many functions or to a significant amount of your data. Once you accept, you are responsible for results of using this item on your phone.

#### To open the application you have downloaded:

- On Play Store screen, touch Menu icon and My apps.
- Touch the installed application in the list, then touch **Open**.

#### To buy an application<sup>(1)</sup>

On **Play Store**, some applications are labeled as free, while some of them are to be paid for before downloading and installing.

- Touch the application you want to buy.
- Touch the price on the up-right of the screen to preview the functions and data the application can access on your phone if you install it.
- Touch Continue to confirm.
- When making your first purchase, you are required to input your credit card information and to log in to Google payment and billing service.
- If your account has multiple credit card accounts, select one to proceed.
- Select the Terms of service link and read the document. When finished, touch **Back** key.
- Mark the checkbox if you agree with the terms of service.
- Touch **Buy now** at the bottom of the screen.

When finished, Android downloads the application.

#### To request a refund

If you are not satisfied with the application, you can ask for a refund within 15 minutes of the purchase. Your credit card will not be charged and the application will be removed. If you change your mind, you can install the application again, but you will not be able to request a refund.

- Touch Menu icon and **My apps** from Play Store screen.
- Touch the application that you want to uninstall and refund.
- Touch **Refund** to uninstall the application and refund. If the button becomes **Uninstall**, your trial period has expired.
- In the survey form, select the answer that best matches your reason, and touch  $\mathbf{OK}.$

## 7.3 Manage your downloads

After you downloaded and installed an application, the following further operations are available for your selection.

#### View

On Play Store screen, touch Menu icon and My apps.

#### Uninstall

On Play Store screen, touch Menu icon and **My apps**. Touch the application you want to uninstall to enter the details screen, touch **Uninstall**, and finally touch **OK** to confirm.

#### Refund

On Play Store screen, touch Menu icon and My apps. Touch the application you want to uninstall for a refund, touch **Refund**, and finally touch **OK** to confirm.

#### Update notification

On Play Store screen, touch Menu icon and **My apps**. Touch Menu icon and **Settings\Notifications** to enable update notification.

#### Auto update

To auto update all installed applications, touch Menu icon and **My apps** from Play Store screen. Touch Menu icon and **Settings\Auto-update apps** to enable this function.

#### **Rate and review**

Open the details screen for an application, touch the stars under **RATE & REVIEW** to award and input comments, touch **OK** to confirm.

### Flag

You can report an inappropriate application to Play Store by flagging it. Open the details screen for the application, scroll to the bottom and touch **Flag as inappropriate**, enter the reason and finally touch **Submit**.

# **8** Multimedia applications


## 8.1 Camera.....



Your mobile phone is fitted with a Camera for taking photos and shooting videos.

Before using the Camera, please ensure that a microSD card where all pictures and videos are stored is correctly installed. Also, be sure to open the protective lens cover before use to avoid it affecting your picture quality.

To access this function, touch Application tab from the Home screen and then touch **Camera**.



#### To take a picture

The screen acts as the viewfinder. First position the object or landscape in the viewfinder, touch the screen to focus if necessary, touch **o** icon to take the picture which will be automatically saved.

#### To shoot a video

Switch Camera mode to Video mode. First position the object or landscape in the viewfinder, and touch o icon to start recording. Touch icon to stop recording. The video will be automatically saved.

## Further operations when viewing a picture/video you have taken

- Touch the icon of gmail, Bluetooth, MMS, etc to share the photo or video you have taken.
- Touch the photo to access Gallery.
- Touch the Back key to return to camera or Camcorder.

#### 8.1.1 Settings in framing mode

Before taking a photo/shooting a video, touch the icon **E** and **i** to adjust a number of settings in framing mode.

#### **Camera settings**

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Scene Mode	Touch to adjust the scene: Auto, Night, Sunset, Party, etc.
Exposure	Touch to adjust the value of exposure.
White balance	Touch to adjust color in different lights: Auto, Incandescent, Daylight, Fluorescent, Cloudy, etc.
Capture mode	Touch to adjust the capture mode: Normal, HDR, Auto scene detect, Smile shot, etc.
Grid	Touch to turn on/off grid.

Touch the icon it to to set Store location, Shutter sound, Picture size, ISO, etc.

#### **Camcorder settings:**

- Scene Mode Touch to adjust the scene: Auto, Night.
- Exposure Touch to adjust the value of exposure.
- White balance Touch to adjust color in different lights: Auto, Incandescent, Daylight, Fluorescent or Cloudy.
- Time lapse interval Touch to set time lapse interval.

Touch the icon it o set Store location, Shutter sound, Microphone, Duration, Video quality, etc.

## 8.2 Gallery.....

Gallery acts as a media player for you to view photos and playback videos. In addition, a set of further operations to pictures and videos are available for your choice.

To access this function, touch Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Gallery**.

Touch to select categories: Albums, Locations, Times, People and Tags.



-Touch to open camera.

Touch the album to spread it apart.

Slide left or right to view more albums.

#### To view a picture/play a video

Pictures and videos are displayed by albums in Gallery.

Touch to return to gallery's main screen



Slide left or right to view more pictures.

Touch to play the

slideshow

- Touch an album and all pictures or videos will spread the screen.
- Touch the picture/video directly to view or play it.
- Slide left/right to view previous or next pictures/videos.

#### Working with pictures

You can work with pictures by rotating or cropping them, sharing them with friends, setting them as contact photo or wallpaper, etc.

Locate the picture you want to work on, touch the picture from fullscreen picture view. Slide the picture bar below left and right to select one, touch icon  $\leq$  to share the picture, touch icon  $\stackrel{\text{def}}{=}$  (only show in landscape mode)and **Delete** to delete the picture.

Touch menu icon from full-screen picture view, more options will show for you to choose.

## Touch 📈 to edit a picture.



- O Touch to adjust whitebalance: Fill Lights, Highlights, Shadows, Autofix.
- Output to adjust effects: Cross-Process, Posterize, Lomo, etc.
- Output to adjust the color: Warmth, Saturation, B&W. Sepia, etc.
- O Touch to see more edit options: Crop, Red Eye, Rotate, Flip, etc.
- S Touch to undo last edit operation.
- O Touch to retrieve last undo.
- 7 Touch to save the picture when the edit is done.
- I Touch to exit edit mode.



After activating the crop mode, the cropping square appears in the middle of the picture. Select the portion to crop, touch **Crop** to Save, touch **Back** key to exit without saving.

#### **Batch operation**

Gallery provides a multi-select function, so that you can work with pictures/videos in batches.

Open the main Gallery window or an album, touch menu icon and **Select album** or **Select item** to activate batch operation mode (you can also touch and hold one album/picture), then touch albums/pictures you want to work on. Touch is icon to perform further actions, like delete and rotate. Touch is to share selected ones.

## 8.3 YouTube .....

YouTube is an online video-sharing service where the user can download, share and view videos. It supports a streaming function that allows you to start watching videos almost as soon as they begin downloading from the Internet.

To access this function, touch Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **YouTube**.



As an online video service, your phone must have a network connection to access  $\ensuremath{\mathsf{YouTube}}$ .

All videos in YouTube are grouped into several categories, like Most Popular, Most Discussed, Featured Videos, etc.



By touching Menu icon **1** from YouTube screen, you can set General settings and Search settings for YouTube.For details about these features, please visit the YouTube website: www.YouTube.com

#### 8.3.1 Watch videos

Touch a video to play it. In the Playing screen, you can view information and video comments, and also browse links to related videos.You can also rate, share, label as favorite, create a new playlist, etc from this screen.

To exit video playing screen, touch **Back** key to return to the video list.

#### 8.4 Music .....

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Using this menu, you can play music files stored on the microSD card in your phone. Music files can be downloaded from computer to microSD card using a USB cable.

To access this function, touch Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Music**.

You will find four categories in which all songs are classified: **Artists**, **Albums**, **Songs** and **Playlists**. Slide left and right to view all. Touch Menu icon and **Shuffle all** to shuffle all songs,

## 8.4.1 Playing music

Touch a song or touch **Play** from drop-down menu to play the song.



- Touch to play the current playlist in shuffle mode (tracks are played in random order).
- Output to select repeat mode: Repeating all songs, Repeating current song, or Repeat is off.
- 6 Touch to skip to the previous track in the album, playlist, or shuffle.
- O Touch to skip to the next track in the album, playlist, or shuffle.
- Touch to pause/resume playback.
- **6** Touch to show the displaying song.



While playing songs with Play Music, the operation of pause, play or skip is still available even if the screen is locked.

#### Adjust sound effects

Touch Menu icon **a** and **Sound effects** from Now playing screen to enable and adjust sound effects.

#### 8.4.2 Working with playlists

Playlists allow you to conveniently organize all songs stored in the SD card.

You can create a new playlist, add a song to the list, and delete or rename a playlist.

#### To create a playlist

Touch **Recently added** from Playlists screen, touch i and then **Save as playlist**, enter the name and finally touch **Save**.

#### To delete a playlist

Touch and hold a playlist to show the menu, then touch **Delete**.

#### To rename a playlist

Touch and hold a playlist to show the menu, then touch **Rename**. When finished, touch **Save** to confirm.

## 8.5 Video Player.....

To access this function, touch Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Video player**.

Video player is a small built-in video player that lists all your videos.

Touch an item from the list to play. While playing, use Pause, Stop or Loop as required, touch a point on the timeline to choose the exactly time point to play. Touch  $\mathbf{x}$  switch to play the video in full screen.

# 9 Google Maps ......

## 9.1 Get My Location

## 9.1.1 Choose a data source to decide My Location

Drag down notification panel and touch  $\fbox{}$  to access **Settings**, touch **Location services**.

Mark the checkbox of **Google's location service** to set Wi-Fi and/or mobile networks as My Location data source.

Or mark the checkbox of  $\ensuremath{\textbf{GPS}}$  satellites to set GPS as My Location data source.

## 9.1.2 Open Google Maps and view My Location

Touch Application tab from the Home screen, then touch Maps.

Touch icon on the map to view My Location.

The map will then center on a blue dot with a blue circle around. Your actual position is within the blue circle.



To move the map, drag the map with your finger.

To zoom in and out of a map, pinch or spread your fingers, or you can also zoom in by double-tapping a location on screen.

To clear the map history, touch Menu icon and **Clear Map**.

## 9.2 Search for a location

While viewing a map, touch the search icon  $\mathbf{Q}$  to activate search function.

In the search box, enter an address, a city or a local business.

Touch the icon  $\bigcirc$  to search, and in a while your search results will appear on the map as red dots. You can touch one to show a label.



## 9.3 Star a location

Just like bookmarking a web address on the Internet, you can star any position on the map for later use.

#### 9.3.1 How to star (or unstar) a location

Touch & hold a location on a map

Touch the address rectangle that opens

Touch the gray star at the top of the screen to star the location. (Or touch a gold star to unstar that location.)

#### 9.3.2 View a list of starred items

Touch Maps at the upper-left corner, and touch My Places.

The list of your starred items and their addresses opens.

Touch a location in the list to view it.

# 9.4 Get driving, public transportation or walking directions

#### 9.4.1 Get suggested routes for your trip

Touch icon 📀 from Maps screen.



- Touch enter bar or the triangle to edit your start point by one of the following methods: entering an address, using My Location, selecting a start point on a map, selecting a starred item, selecting an address from your contacts or using search history.
- · Do likewise for your end point.
- To reverse directions, touch Menu icon and touch **Reverse Start** & End.
- Then select a transport mode: driving by car, using public transportation, or walking directions.
- Finally touch GET DIRECTIONS.
- A couple of suggested routes will appear in a list. Touch any routes to view their respective detailed directions.

To get reverse directions for a route you've already made, simply open that route's directions window and touch Menu icon and **Reverse**. No need to enter your start point and end point again.

## 9.4.2 Preview suggested routes and decide on a route more preferable or feasible to you

You can preview each turn in your route in Navigation, Satellite, and other views.

- Touch a left or right arrow to preview the next or previous leg of your route.
- You can view turn-by-turn directions, estimated distance and possible arrival time in a list by touching **DIRECTIONS LIST**, touch **Back** key or **MAP VIEW** to return to previous view.

When selecting a more preferable or feasible route, distance and time will be the two most important factors for your evaluation. Distance and estimated time will be displayed at the top of the directions screen.

#### 9.4.3 Search for locations along your route

Please refer to "9.2 Search for a location" for detailed information.

## 9.5 Arrangement of Layers

Layers allow you to view locations and additional information overlaid on the map. You can add multiple layers or remove only certain layers so you control exactly what information you want visible on the map at one time.

#### 9.5.1 To view multiple layers

Touch icon is from Maps screen. All available layers are listed (like Traffic, Satellite, Terrain, etc), select one to view.

#### 9.5.2 To open Street View for a location

- Touch and hold a location to display a balloon with the address and a Street View thumbnail.
- Touch the balloon and touch **Street view**.

#### 9.5.3 To clear the map

After you get directions or search on a map, you can clear the markers/ layers that have been drawn: touch Menu icon and on maps screen and touch **Clear Map**, or you can also touch **Clear Map** on Layers screen.

# 9.6 Join Latitude to see your friends' locations and share yours with them

With Google Latitude, you can:

- · see your friends' locations on a map or in a list.
- quickly contact your friends with a text message, instant message, or phone call.
- you can share, set, hide your location, or sign out of Google Latitude.
- · control who sees your location, and at what level of detail.
- add Latitude widget to Home screen to see nearby friends at a glance.

## 9.6.1 To join Latitude

Touch Maps at the upper-left corner, and select Latitude.

To open Latitude, touch icon  $\fbox$  from Maps screen, then select Latitude.

#### 9.6.2 How to invite friends to share their locations

- Touch icon 🛃 from list view.
- Touch Select from Contacts or Add via email address.
- After selecting your chosen contacts touch **Add friends** at the bottom of the screen.

When finished, an invitation will be sent to the friends you have invited.

To respond to an invitation, you can select one of the followings:

• Accept and share back	You and your friend can share locations with each other.
<ul> <li>Accept, but hide my location</li> </ul>	You can view your friend's location, but they can not view yours.
• Don't accept	No locations can be shared between you and your friend.

## 9.6.3 To view your friends' location

You can view your friends' locations on a map or in a list.

- MAP VIEW When Google Maps is opened, your friends' locations will display with their photo icons for identification.
- FRIENDS LIST Your friends are displayed in a list.

## 9.6.4 To connect with your friends

Select a contact, you can communicate with your friend and set privacy options.  $% \left( {{{\left[ {{{\left[ {{\left[ {\left( {{{\left[ {{{\left[ {{{\left[ {{{\left[ {{{\left[ {{{\left[ {{{\left[ {{{\left[ {{{\left[ {{{}}}} \right]}}}} \right.$ 

- Map Locate the friend's position on the map.
- Directions Get directions to this friend's location.
- Ping for check-in Send friends a notification and ask them to check in.
- Manage sharing Touch to set sharing options: Share best available location; Share city-level location only; Hide from this friend.
- **Remove this friend** Remove this friend from your list and stop sharing information with him or her.

#### 9.6.5 To control what you share

You can control the information you want to share with your friends.

Touch icon from Maps screen, then select **Latitude**, touch your own name and then touch **Location settings**.

The following options are available to choose from:

Location reporting	Touch to detect/set your location, or stop updating your location.
• Report from this device	Mark the checkbox to enable automatically update location from this device.
• Enable location history	Mark to hide your location history.
<ul> <li>Manage your friends</li> </ul>	Add or remove friends who can see your location.
<ul> <li>Enable location History</li> </ul>	Mark the checkbox to enable record your location history.

# Others.....

## 10.1 File Manager.....

To access this function, touch Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **File Manager**.

**File Manager** works with both external SD card and internal SD card. To use it, you have to install your SD card first. See "Installing or removing the microSD card".

File Manager displays all data stored on both microSD cards, including applications, media files; videos, pictures or audios you have captured; other data transferred via Bluetooth, USB cable, etc.

When you download an application from PC to microSD card, you can locate the application on File Manager, then touch it to install it in your phone.

File Manager allows you to perform and be really efficient with the following common operations: create (sub) folder, open folder/file, view, rename, move, copy, delete, play, share, etc.

## I 0.2 Sound Recorder .....

To access this function, touch Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Sound Recorder**.

Sound Recorder allows you to record voice/sound for seconds/hours.

## 10.3 Radio .....

Your phone is equipped with a radio  $^{(1)}$  with RDS  $^{(2)}$  functionality. You can use the application as a traditional radio with saved channels or with parallel visual information related to the radio program on the display if you turn to stations that offer Visual Radio service.

To access this function, touch Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Radio**.



To use it, you must plug in your headset, which works as an antenna connected with your phone.



#### Available options:

- Save channel Save the current tuned station to the channels list.
- Audio mode
   Listen to the radio using loudspeaker or headset.
- Delete Delete the channel.
- Enter frequency Enter the frequency manually.
- Search Search for all available stations automatically.
- RDS settings Touch to select Channel information and Alternative frequency.
- Record FM Record video voice of the current channel.
- Exit Turn off the radio.

## 10.4 Setup Wizard .....

To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Setup Wizard**.

**Setup Wizard** helps set up your phone in multiple ways: language, input method, mobile data connection, account setup and synchronization, system update, etc. This will also be performed the first time you power on your phone.

- (I) The quality of the radio depends on the coverage of the radio station in that particular area.
- <sup>(2)</sup> Depending on your network operator and market.

## **10.5** Alcatel Help .....



To access this function, touch the Application tab from the Home screen, then touch **Alcatel Help**.

**Alcatel Help** provides help when you have questions or need assistance when using the phone.

## **10.6** Other applications <sup>(1)</sup>.....

The previous applications in this section are preinstalled on your phone. To read a brief introduction of the preinstalled 3rd party applications, please refer to the leaflet provided with the phone. You can also download thousands of 3rd party applications by going to Play Store on your phone.

# Settings......

Drag down notification panel and touch of to access **Settings**.

## II.I Wireless & networks

#### II.I.I SIM management

This function only available on dual SIM card mode.

#### **SIM** information

To activate/deactivate SIM card by touching the switch off.

Touch SIM card to enter SIM information settings:

- Edit SIM name Touch to edit name for SIM card, touch OK to confirm.
- Enter phone Touch to enter phone number show on your phone.
- Set background There are four background color can be selected.
- Display numbers Touch to select display First 4 digits, Last digits, or Do not display.

#### Default SIM

Touch to set default SIM for Voice call, Video call, Messaging, Data connection.

#### **General settings**

- Roaming Touch to select SIM for data roaming and frequency of show roaming reminder.
- Contacts & SIM Touch to associated contact numbers stored in phone with a specific SIM.

<sup>&</sup>lt;sup>(1)</sup> Application availability depends on country and operator.

#### 11.1.2 Wi-Fi

Using Wi-Fi you can now surf the Internet without using your SIM card whenever you are in range of a wireless network. The only thing you have to do is to enter the **Wi-Fi** screen and configure an access point to connect your phone to the wireless network.

For detailed instructions on using Wi-Fi, please refer to "6.1.2 Wi-Fi".

#### II.I.3 Bluetooth

Bluetooth allows your phone to exchange data (videos, images, music, etc.) in a small range with another Bluetooth supported device (phone, computer, printer, headset, car kit, etc.).

For more information on Bluetooth, please refer to "6.3 Connecting to Bluetooth devices".

#### II.I.4 Data usage

To enable/disable mobile data by touching the switch

Mark the checkbox of **Set mobile data limit**, then you can drag the limit line and the warning line according to your limitation. Your mobile data connection will be disabled when the specified limit is reached. You can also choose a data usage cycle to view the statistics and related applications of used data by your phone.

Touch the Menu icon **I**, and you can view more settings related to your data usage.



Data usage is measured by your phone, and your carrier may count differently. Please consider using a conservative limit.

#### II.I.5 Airplane mode

Mark the checkbox of **Airplane mode** to simultaneously disable all wireless connections including Wi-Fi, Bluetooth and more.

#### 11.1.6 VPN

A mobile virtual private network (mobile VPN or mVPN) provides mobile devices with access to network resources and software applications on their home network, when they connect via other wireless or wired networks. Mobile VPNs are used in environments where workers need to keep application sessions open at all times, throughout the working day, as the user connects via various wireless networks, encounters gaps in coverage, or suspend-and-resumes their devices to preserve battery life. A conventional VPN cannot survive such events because the network tunnel is disrupted, causing applications to disconnect, time out, fail, or even the computing device itself to crash.

## **II.2** Device

#### II.2.I Gestures

Mark the checkbox to enable the following gestures: **Turn over to mute, Turn over to activate, Shake to switch music**.

#### **11.2.2** Audio profiles

Use the Audio profiles settings to configure ringtones for different events and environments.

#### General

To modify the sound settings within any profile, touch General to view the following functions by scrolling up/down. When finished, mark the check box on the right of the profile's name to activate the action.

- Phone vibrate Mark the check box to vibrate phone for incoming calls.
- Volume Touch to set volume for incoming calls, alarm and notifications.
- Voice call ringtone Touch to set your default voice incoming call ringtone.
- Video call Touch to set your default video incoming call ringtone.
- Default Touch to set your default notification ringtone.
- Dial pad touch Mark the check box to enable playing tones when using dial pad.

- Audible selection Mark the check box to enable playing sound when making screen selection.
- Screen lock sound Mark the check box to enable sounds to play when locking and unlocking the screen.
- Haptic feedback Mark the check box to activate vibration when pressing soft keys and on certain UI interactions.
- Power on ringtone Set your default power on ringtone.
- Shut down Set your default power off ringtone. ringtone

#### Silent

This profile will silence all sounds except media & alarms.

#### Meeting

When this is selected the phone will not ring or beep by default unless an alarm has been set. A new event will cause it to vibrate.

#### Outdoor

This profile is designed for outdoor users who require louder ringtones.

#### 11.2.3 Display

- Brightness Touch to adjust the brightness of the screen.
- Wallpaper Touch to set the wallpaper.
- Orientation Touch to select whether rotate screen automatically or not.
- Sleep Touch to set screen timeout.
- Font size Touch to set the fond size.

#### 11.2.4 Storage

Use these settings to monitor the total and available space on your phone and on your microSD card; to manage your microSD card; and if necessary, to reset the phone, erasing all of your personal information.

#### Default write disk

Touch to select your storage device, internal device storage or SD card.

#### **Phone storage**

This menu displays the amount of internal phone storage in different colours. The available space will be shown in grey, which shows the amount of internal phone storage used by the operating system, its components, applications (including those you downloaded), permanent and temporary data.



If a warning message comes up saying that phone memory is limited, you are required to free up space by deleting some unwanted applications, downloaded files, etc.

#### SD card

Lists the amount of space on any microSD card installed in your phone and the amount you can use to store applications, videos, music, and other files. you can touch one category to access the function and learn more in details

#### Mount/Unmount SD card

You must mount the microSD card before using applications and files in it, or formatting the microSD card. Unmount the microSD card from your phone so that you can safely remove it when the phone is on.

#### Format SD card

Permanently format everything on a microSD card and prepares it for use with your phone.

#### 11.2.5 Battery

In battery screen you can view the battery usage data since you last connected the phone to a power source. The screen also shows your battery status and how long it has been used since last charging. Touch one category, then you can learn its specific power consumption.

You can adjust power use via the screen brightness or screen timeout in Display screen.

### **II.2.6** Applications

You use the Applications settings to view details about the applications installed on your phone, to manage their data and force them to stop, and to set whether you want to permit installation of applications that you obtain from web sites and emails.

## **II.3** Personal

### **11.3.1** Location services

#### Use GPS satellites

Check to use your phone's global positioning system (GPS) satellite receiver to pinpoint your location within an accuracy as close as several meters ("street level"). The process of accessing the GPS satellite and setting your phone's precise location for the first time will require up to 5 minutes. You will need to stand in a place with a clear view of the sky and avoid moving. After this, GPS will only need 20-40 seconds to identify your precise location.

Mark the checkbox of  $\ensuremath{\text{Lock SIM}}$  card to lock the SIM card with PIN code.

Touch Change SIM PIN to change the PIN code.

#### Make passwords visible

Mark the checkbox to show passwords as you type.

**Device administrators** 

Touch to view or deactivate device administrators.

#### Unknown sources

Mark the checkbox to permit installation of applications that you obtain from web sites, emails, or other locations other than Play Store.

To protect your phone and personal data, download applications only from trusted sources, such as Play Store.

#### **Trusted credentials**

Touch to display trusted CA certificates.

#### Install from SD card

Touch to install encrypted certificates from the microSD card.

#### **Clear storage**

Touch to remove all certificates.

#### 11.3.3 Language & input

Use the Language & input settings to select the language for the text on your phone and for configuring the onscreen keyboard. You can also configure voice input settings and the pointer speed.

#### Language

Touch to select the language and the region you want.

#### Spell checker

Mark the checkbox to enable the system to show suggested words.

#### **Personal dictionary**

Touch to open a list of the words you've added to the dictionary. Touch a word to edit or delete it. Touch the add button (+) to add a word.

#### Default

Touch to select a default input method. Touch **Configure input methods** to show all input methods. Touch the settings icon of to configure a certain input method.

#### Android keyboard

The Android keyboard settings apply to the onscreen keyboard that is included with your phone. The correction and capitalization features affect only the English version of the keyboard. Available options are as follows:

#### Input languages

Touch to set input language.

Auto-capitalisation

Mark the checkbox to have the onscreen keyboard automatically capitalize the first letter of the first word after a period, the first word in a text field, and each word in name fields.

Touch to choose a preferred text-to-speech engine, touch the settings icon of to show more choices for each engine.

• Speech rate

Touch to open a dialog where you can select how quickly you want the synthesizer to speak.

• Listen to an example

Touch to play a brief sample of the speech synthesizer, using your current settings.

#### **Pointer speed**

Touch to open a dialog where you can change the pointer speed, touch  $\mathbf{OK}$  to confirm.

#### 11.3.4 Backup and reset

#### Back up my data

Mark the checkbox to back up your phone's settings and other application data to Google Servers, with your Google Account. If you replace your phone, the settings and data you've backed up are restored onto the new phone for the first time you sign in with your Google Account. If you mark this option, a wide variety of settings and data are backed up, including your Wi-Fi passwords, bookmarks, a list of the applications you've installed, the words you've added to the dictionary used by the onscreen keyboard, and most of the settings that you configure with the Settings application. If you unmark this option, you stop backing up your settings, and any existing backups are deleted from Google Servers.

#### **Back up account**

Touch to back up your account.

#### Automatic restore

Mark the checkbox to restore your backed up settings or other data when you reinstall an application.

#### **DRM** reset

Touch to deletes all DRM licenses.

#### **Factory data reset**

Erase all of your personal data from internal phone storage, including information about your Google Account, any other accounts, your system and application settings, and any downloaded applications. Resetting the phone does not erase any system software updates you've downloaded or any files on your microSD card, such as music or photos. If you reset the phone in this way, you're prompted to re-enter the same kind of information as when you first started Android.

When you are unable to power on your phone, there is another way to perform a factory data reset by using hardware keys. Press the **Volume up** key and the **Power** key at same time until the screen lights up.

## **II.4** Accounts

Use the settings to add, remove, and manage your Email and other supported accounts. You can also use these settings to control how and whether all applications send, receive, and synchronize data on their own schedules, and whether all applications can synchronize user data automatically.

#### Automatic date & time

Mark the checkbox to use network provided time or use  $\ensuremath{\mathsf{GPS}}$  provided time.

#### Automatic time zone

Mark the checkbox to use network-provided time zone. Or unmark to set all values manually.

#### Set date

Touch to open a dialog where you can manually set the phone's date.

#### Set time

Touch to open a dialog where you can manually set the phone's time.

#### Select time zone

Touch to open a dialog where you can set the phone's time zone.

#### Use 24-hour format

Mark the checkbox to display the time using 24-hour clock format.

#### Select date format

Touch to open a dialog where you can select the format for displaying dates.

#### 11.5.2 Scheduled power on & off

Set a scheduled time for power on & off .

#### 11.5.3 Accessibility

You use the Accessibility settings to configure any accessibility plug-ins you have installed on your phone.

#### Talkback

Touch to turn/off the function which provides spoken feedback to help blind and low-vision users.

#### Large text

Mark the checkbox to enlarge the screen text.

#### Power button ends call

Mark the checkbox to end a call by pressing Power key during the call.

#### Orientation

Mark the checkbox to rotate screen automatically.

#### Speak passwords

Mark the checkbox to speak passwords while typing.

#### Touch & hold delay

Touch to adjust the duration of touch and hold delay. This function enables your phone to differ touch and touch & hold, which may avoid incorrect operations.

#### Install web scripts

Touch to open a dialog which asks you to install scripts from Google which make their web content more accessible. Touch **Allow** to confirm.

This contains information about Product model, Manufacturer name, IMEI, and related certification details.

### 11.5.5 Quick start

Mark the checkbox to active  $\ensuremath{\mathsf{Quick}}$  start mode, the mode will shorten boot time.

#### 11.5.6 About phone

This contains information about things ranging from Legal information, Model number, Firmware version, Baseband version, Kernel version, Build number etc.

#### Advanced settings

Touch to turn on/off more settings options as below:

Desktop backup password

Touch to set/change/remove desktop full backup password.

#### • Stay awake

Mark the checkbox to prevent the screen from dimming and locking when the phone is connected to a charger or to a USB device that provides power. Don't use this setting with a static image on the phone for long periods of time, or the screen may be marked with that image.

#### Protect SD card

Mark the checkbox to request permission before reading SD card.

#### USB debugging

Mark the checkbox to permit debugging tools on a computer to communicate with your phone via a USB connection.

#### Allow mock locations

Mark the checkbox to permit a development tool on a computer to control where the phone believes it is located, rather than using the phone's own internal tools for this purpose.

Touch to view legal information.

#### My phone has not responded for several minutes

## When I select a number from my contacts, the number cannot be dialed
