





During ringing: Press to answer a call

1.3. Base Station Overview



- 1.** Press on the base station to page your handset. It will ring for approximately 60 seconds.
Press and hold on the base station for about five seconds, the base station is entered into registration mode and allows handset registration.
- 2.** Increase (+) speaker volume during message playback.


3. 7-SEG LED DISPLAY

- OF-> -- When answering machine is OFF
 - On-> XX When answering machine is ON where XX is number of messages in TAM memory
 - 00 Steadily ON: No voice messages in TAM
 - XX Flash: There are XX new voice messages received where XX is from 01 to 59
 - ZZ Steadily ON: There are ZZ old voice messages kept in the TAM memory (no new voice messages)
 - XX/FF Flash XX alternatively with FF: There are XX new voice messages received where XX is from 01 to 59 and the TAM memory is full
 - FF Flash FF: TAM memory is full and there are no new messages, only old messages are kept in TAM memory
 - /XX Flash XX alternatively with --: Time is not set and there are XX new voice messages received where XX is from 01 to 59
 - Flash --: Time is not set and there are old voice messages kept in the TAM memory only (no new voice messages)
 - XX Steadily ON: Playing the current XX incoming old message

- 4.** Press to turn on the answering machine
Press again to turn off the answering machine
 - 5.** Press to play the message
Press again to stop the message playback

- 6.** Press to skip the current message and play the next message
- 7.** Press once to delete the message during playback
Press and hold to delete all the messages
Note: New voice messages will not be deleted
- 8.** Steadily on while the handset is charging or in use. (Applicable only when the LED I/O switch is slid to "I")
Flash when receiving an incoming call. (Applicable only when the LED I/O switch is slid to "I")
- 9.** Press to repeat playing the current message from the beginning
Press twice to skip backward to the previous message
- 10.** Decrease (-) speaker volume during message playback
- 11. LED I/O SWITCH (Bottom of the Base)**
Slide the switch to "O" position to turn off the base LED
Slide the switch to "I" position to turn on the base LED when the handset is charging on the base or in use

1.4. Display Icons and Symbols

The LCD display gives you information on the current status of the telephone.



- Steadily on when the handset is in range of the base.
Flash when out of range of the base or not registered to the base.
- Steadily on when an intercom is in progress.
Flash when there is an incoming internal call.
- Indicate a call is in progress.
- Versatis F250 Voice only
Indicate that handsfree is being used.
- Indicate when the telephone answering machine (TAM) is turned on.
Flash when new TAM messages are received.
- Steadily on when an alarm is set.
Flash when the alarm time set before reaches.
- Indicate that the keypad is locked.
- Indicate when there are received new Voice Message Waiting (VMWI) not yet read.
Disappear when all the voice messages have been read. (Network service dependent)
- Indicate that the ringer is switched off.
- Indicate when the battery is fully charged.
Whole icon flashes when the battery performs initial charging.
Internal block icon flashes when the battery is in final charging stage.

- Indicate when the battery needs charging.
Flash when low battery power level is detected.
- Indicate when more characters are existed before the text currently displayed.
- Indicate when more characters are existed after the text currently displayed.
- Indicate when new TAM message/new call.
Turn off when new TAM message/new call has been read.
- Scroll up/down the menu items/Phonebook list/Redial list/Call List.

2. PRECAUTIONS

The signal quality will depend on the location and environment of the base and handset.

Position your **Versatis F200 Voice/Versatis F250 Voice** away from sources of excessive heat (radiators, direct sunlight, etc.) and protect it from vibrations and dust. Never allow your telephone to come into contact with water or other liquids, or with aerosols. To reduce the risk of interference and optimize reception, take particular care not to install the base in the immediate vicinity of windows, large metal objects, reinforced concrete, televisions, music centres, VCR or DVD players, halogen lamps or heating devices, fluorescent lighting, burglar alarms, microwave ovens, computers, etc.

This telephone requires an electrical power supply in order to function. To clean your **Versatis F200 Voice/Versatis F250 Voice**, use an antistatic cloth lightly moistened with water.

NB: Your **Versatis F200 Voice/Versatis F250 Voice** is a DECT™ standard appliance designed to receive and transmit telephone calls. It is designed for connection to the public telecommunications network.


3. INSTALLING YOUR PHONE

3.1. Installing and Charging the Batteries

- Slide down to open the battery compartment cover.
- Place the 2 supplied AAA rechargeable batteries as indicated. Pay extra attention to direction of polarity.
- Slide the battery compartment cover back.
- Put the handset on the base and charge for 15 hours before using the handset for the first time. The handset will give a beep when it is properly placed on the base or charger.

Notes:


- Use only the supplied NiMH rechargeable batteries.
- If the handset will not be used for a long time, disconnect and remove the batteries to prevent possible leakage.



3.2. Connecting the Base Station

- Plug one end of the telephone line cord into the telephone jack on base bottom.
- Plug the small end of power adapter into a power jack on base bottom.
- Connect the power supply plug to the base jack horizontally, and route the power supply cord through the slot.**
- Plug the large end of power adapter into a wall power outlet.
- Plug the other end of the telephone line cord in to the telephone jack or micro-filter.

- Always use the cables provided in the box.



If you have broadband service, a micro-filter (not included) is required.

3.3. Connecting the Charger(s) (for Duo/Trio models)

Plug the power adapter into mains socket.

If you have a Broadband line

If you connect your telephone to a line with a broadband connection, you will need to insert a micro-filter between the telephone and the telephone line, otherwise you may get interference between the telephone and the broadband, which could cause problems.

In a home with broadband, every telephone must have a micro-filter connected, not just the one at the telephone point that your modem is connected to. If you need more broadband micro-filters, contact your broadband supplier.

4. USING YOUR PHONE

4.1. Make a Call

4.1.1. Preparatory Dialing

Enter the phone number and press or (Versatis F250 Voice Only) to dial the number. Press to clear the entry.

4.1.2. Direct Dialing
Press or (Versatis F250 Voice Only) to take the line and enter the phone number.

4.1.3. Dial from Direct Memory Keys

In idle or off hook mode, press and hold / to dial the direct memory number. You have to store number to the related key first. See section 7.4 for reference.

4.1.4. Call from the Redial List

Press (Versatis F200 Voice Only) or (Versatis F250 Voice Only) to access the redial list and press / to select the desired redial number. Press or (Versatis F250 Voice Only) to dial out to the selected redial number.

4.2. Handset Speakerphone (Versatis F250 Voice Only)

During a call, you can press to alternate between handsfree and normal handset use.

5. PRIVATE PHONEBOOK

Your phone can store up to 50 private phonebook entries with names and numbers. Each phonebook entry can have a maximum of 20 digits for the phone number and 12 characters for the name. You can also select different ringtones for your phonebook entries. Phonebook entries are stored alphabetically by name.

5.1. Add a New Phonebook Entry

- In idle:
- Press to access the phonebook.
OR
Press and / to select **PHONEBOOK** main menu item and then press to access the phonebook.
 - Press to select **ADD**.
 - Press to enter the name.
 - Press to enter the number.
 - Press and / to select the desired ringtone for your phonebook entry.
 - Press to store the phonebook entry.

5.2. Call from the Phonebook

- In idle:
- Press to access the phonebook.
OR
Press and / to select **PHONEBOOK** main menu item and then press to access the phonebook.
 - Press or (Versatis F250 Voice Only) to dial out to the selected phonebook entry.

6. CALLER DISPLAY (NETWORK DEPENDENT)

This feature is available if you have subscribed the Caller Line Identification service with your telephone service provider. Your phone can store up to 20 received calls with date/time information in the Call List. The number will be shown on the LCD when the phone is ringing. If the number matches with one of the entries in your Private Phonebook, the caller's name stored in the private phonebook will be displayed alternatively with the number. The handset will ring with the melody associated with that phonebook entry.

If the caller number is disabled to send caller information, **"WITHHELD"** will display.

If the caller number is not provided, **"OUT OF AREA"** will display. In standby, if three unanswered calls are received, **"3 NEW CALLS"** will be displayed.

6.1. View the Call List

All received calls are saved in Call List with the latest call putting at the top of the list. When the call list is full, the oldest call will be replaced by a new

call. The unanswered call which has not been read is marked with a **★** at the centre of the bottom line of the display.

- Press to access the call list.
OR
Press and / to select **CALL LIST**.
- Press / to select the desired entry.
- Press to view the caller's number if applicable.

6.2. Call from the Call List

- In idle:
- Press to access the call list.
OR
Press and / to select **CALL LIST**.
 - Press or (Versatis F250 Voice Only) to dial out to the selected phonebook entry.

7. PHONE SETTINGS

7.1. Set the Ringer Melody for Internal/External Calls

- Press and / to select **HS SETTINGS**.
- Press and / to select **RING SETUP**.
- Press and / to select **INT RING** or **EXT RING**.
- Press and / to select the desired ringer melody from the melody list.

Note: The respective ringer melody will be played while browsing the melody list.

7.2. Set the Ringer Volume

- Press and / to select **HS SETTINGS**.
- Press and / to select **RING SETUP**.
- Press and / to select **RING VOLUME**.
- Press and / to select the desired ringer volume (a total of 6 ringer volume levels including **VOLUME OFF**).

Note: The respective ringer volume will be played during your selection. If **VOLUME OFF** is selected, icon will display.

7.3. Adjust Earpiece and Handsfree (Versatis F250 Voice Only)

Volume
There are 5 levels (**VOLUME 1** to **VOLUME 5**) to choose from for each of earpiece and handsfree (Versatis F250 Voice Only) volume.

During a call:
Press / to select volume 1-5. The current setting is shown. When you end the call, the setting will remain at the last selected level.

7.4. Store Direct Memory Access Number

You can store three direct access numbers into digit KEY 1, KEY 2 and KEY 3, which will be convenient for you to dial to these numbers directly.

1. Press **[OK]** and **▼/▲** to select **HS SETTINGS**.
2. Press **[OK]** and **▼/▲** to select **DIRECT MEM**.
3. Press **[OK]** and **▼/▲** to select any one from **KEY 1, KEY 2** and **KEY 3**.
4. Press **[OK]** and then enter the number you would like to store, or edit the number existed before.
5. Press **[OK]** to confirm.

Note: Press and hold **[1]**, **[2]** or **[3]** to call the stored number.

8. ANSWERING MACHINE

Your phone includes a telephone answering machine that records unanswered calls when it is on. The message counter on the base will show the number of the messages when the answering machine is on. The answering machine can store up to 59 messages within the maximum recording time of approximately 18 minutes. As well as recording incoming messages, you can record memos for other users of your phone. If the answering machine memory is full, the Handset will display **TAM FULL** and the handset name alternatively in standby, or display **TAM FULL** and the date/time information in standby.

8.1. Turn On/Off the Answering Machine

You can turn on or off the answering machine through the base or handset. When the answering machine is set to **ON**, calls will be answered after the set answer delay and the caller can then leave you a message. When the answering machine is set to **OFF**, calls will be answered after 10 rings and the answer only message will be played to your callers. They will not be able to leave you a message.

Through the Base:

1. Press **[ON/OFF]** on the base station.
- If answering machine is set to **ON**, **[ON/OFF]** displays on the handset LCD and the 7-seg LED on the base station will display the number of incoming messages.
- If answering machine is set to **OFF**, **[ON/OFF]** will disappear from the handset LCD and the 7-seg LED on the base station will display - .

Through the Handset:

1. Press **[OK]** and **▼/▲** to select **ANS. MACHINE**.
 2. Press **[OK]** and **▼/▲** to select **TAM ON/OFF**.
 3. Press **[OK]** and **▼/▲** to select **ON** or **OFF**.
 4. Press **[OK]** to confirm.
- If answering machine is set to **ON**, **[ON/OFF]** displays on the handset LCD and the 7-seg LED on the base station will display the number of incoming messages.
- If answering machine is set to **OFF**, **[ON/OFF]** will disappear from the handset LCD and the 7-seg LED on the base station will display - .

8.2. Listen to the Messages in the Answering Machine

When new messages are recorded on the answering machine, **[MSG]** flashes on the handset display and the message counter on base flashes with the number of new messages in the answering machine until all the new messages are played. Old messages will be played after all new messages are played completely.

Listen new messages through the Base:

1. Press **[▶]** on the base station.
2. The new messages are played from the loudspeaker on the base station in the sequence they are recorded.
3. Press **▲** or **▼** on the base station to increase or decrease the volume during message playback respectively.

Listen new messages through the Handset:

1. Press **[OK]** and **▼/▲** to select **ANS. MACHINE**.
2. Press **[OK]** and **▼/▲** to select **MSG PLAYBACK**.
3. Press **[OK]** to start message playback and the screen displays the date and time information of the message received.
4. During message playback, press **▼/▲** to increase or decrease the message playback volume respectively.
5. Press **[OK]** to select **STOP, FORWARD, PREVIOUS, DELETE** to perform the following functions during message playback.

STOP: Stop the current message playback and return to the **ANS. MACHINE** menu.

FORWARD: Skip to play the next message. The date and time information of the next message will display if there is next message.

PREVIOUS: Skip to repeat playing the current message from the beginning. The date and time information of the current message will display.

DELETE: Delete the current message and the next message will be played.

Note: Alternatively, you can use the following shortcut keys to control different operation during message playback.

- Press **[STOP]** to stop message playback.
- Press **[NEXT]** to skip to repeat playing the current message from the beginning. Press **[NEXT]** twice to skip backward to the previous message.
- Press **[PREV]** to skip to play next message.
- Press **[DELETE]** to delete the current message playback.

6. Press **[OK]** to confirm.

8.3. Delete All Messages in the Answering Machine

Delete all messages through the Base:

In idle:

1. Press and hold **[X]** on the base station.
2. All the old messages will be deleted.

Delete all messages through the Handset:

1. Press **[OK]** and **▼/▲** to select **ANS. MACHINE**.
2. Press **[OK]** and **▼/▲** to select **DELETE ALL**.
3. Press **[OK]** to confirm.
4. Press **[OK]** to delete all old messages.

8.4. Record Memo

You can record your memo message for another user.

1. Press **[OK]** and **▼/▲** to select **ANS. MACHINE**.
 2. Press **[OK]** and **▼/▲** to select **MEMO**.
 3. Press **[OK]** to start memo recording and **"RECORDING"** is displayed.
 4. Press **[OK]** to stop memo recording and save the memo.
- OR
4. Press **[MEMO]** to stop memo recording without saving and return back to **ANS. MACHINE** menu.

8.5. Answering Machine Settings

You can use the **TAM SETTINGS** menu through the handset to change the settings of your answering machine.

8.5.1. Set the Answer Mode

By default, the answer machine is set in **ANS & REC** mode which allows callers to leave a message. This mode can be changed to **ANSWER ONLY** which does not allow callers to leave a message. In that case, your callers will be prompted to call back later.

1. Press **[OK]** and **▼/▲** to select **ANS. MACHINE**.
2. Press **[OK]** and **▼/▲** to select **TAM SETTINGS**.
3. Press **[OK]** and **▼/▲** to select **ANSWER MODE**.
4. Press **[OK]** and **▼/▲** to select **ANS & REC** or **ANSWER ONLY**.
5. Press **[OK]** to confirm.

8.5.2. Set the Outgoing Message Language

The answering machine announces the outgoing message when it answers a call. There is a pre-set OGM for each of **ANS & REC** mode or **ANSWER ONLY** mode. You are able to select your desired OGM language to playback.

1. Press **[OK]** and **▼/▲** to select **ANS. MACHINE**.
2. Press **[OK]** and **▼/▲** to select **TAM SETTINGS**.
3. Press **[OK]** and **▼/▲** to select **TAM LANGUAGE**.
4. Press **[OK]** and **▼/▲** to select your desired OGM language.
5. Press **[OK]** to confirm.

8.5.3. Record Your Own Outgoing Message (OGM)

You can record your own OGM for **ANS & REC** mode or **ANSWER ONLY** mode. When you record your own OGM, it will be used when the answering machine answers the call. If your personalized OGM is deleted, the pre-set OGM will be restored automatically.

1. Press **[OK]** and **▼/▲** to select **ANS. MACHINE**.
2. Press **[OK]** and **▼/▲** to select **TAM SETTINGS**.
3. Press **[OK]** and **▼/▲** to select **OGM SETTINGS**.
4. Press **[OK]** and **▼/▲** to select **ANS & REC** or **ANSWER ONLY**.

5. Press **[OK]** and **▼/▲** to select **RECORD MESS**.
6. Press **[OK]** to start recording your personalized OGM and **"RECORDING"** is displayed on the screen.
7. Press **[OK]** to stop and save your personalized OGM. The newly saved OGM will playback automatically. Alternatively, press **[MEMO]** to return to previous screen without saving the personalized OGM.

8.5.4. Playback and Delete the Outgoing Message (OGM)

You can playback your own personalized OGM or the pre-set OGM for **ANS & REC** mode or **ANSWER ONLY** mode and choose to delete your personalized OGM during playback and record a new one whenever you want. Please note that pre-set OGM cannot be deleted.

8.5.4.1. Playback the OGM

1. Press **[OK]** and **▼/▲** to select **ANS. MACHINE**.
2. Press **[OK]** and **▼/▲** to select **TAM SETTINGS**.
3. Press **[OK]** and **▼/▲** to select **OGM SETTINGS**.
4. Press **[OK]** and **▼/▲** to select **ANS & REC** or **ANSWER ONLY**.
5. Press **[OK]** and **▼/▲** to select **PLAYBACK**.
6. Press **[OK]** to playback your personalized OGM (if you have recorded a personalized OGM before) and **"PLAYING OGM"** is displayed on the screen.
7. Press **[OK]** to stop the OGM playback and return to the previous menu.

Note: If a personalized OGM is not recorded before, the pre-set OGM will be played.

8.5.4.2. Delete the personalized OGM

1. Repeat Steps 1 to 6 in Section 8.5.4.1.
2. Press **[MEMO]** to delete your personalized OGM and return to previous menu and the pre-set OGM is restored automatically.

Note: If pre-set OGM is playing, you are not allowed to delete the pre-set OGM and thus **C** will not display. Only **OK** will display.

8.5.5. Set the Answer Delay

You can set the number of rings before the answering machine answers and starts playing your OGM. You can set the answering machine to answer after two to eight rings or **TIME SAVER**.

1. Press **[OK]** and **▼/▲** to select **ANS. MACHINE**.
2. Press **[OK]** and **▼/▲** to select **TAM SETTINGS**.
3. Press **[OK]** and **▼/▲** to select **ANSWER DELAY** (Available options: **2 RINGS, 4 RINGS, 6 RINGS, 8 RINGS** or **TIME SAVER**).
4. Press **[OK]** and **▼/▲** to select your desired answer delay.
5. Press **[OK]** to confirm.

9. REGISTRATION

Your handset and base station is pre-registered. Up to five handsets can be registered to a single base station.

If for some reason, the handset is not registered to the base station (**#** flashes even when the handset is near the base station), register your handset according to the following procedure.

1. Press and hold **[#]** on the base station for about five seconds, the base station is entered into registration mode.
2. Press **[OK]** and **▼/▲** to select **REGISTRATION**.
3. Press **[OK]** and you are requested to enter the 4-digit system PIN (default PIN is 0000).
4. Enter the 4-digit system PIN
5. Press **[OK]** to confirm.

If the handset registration is successful, you will hear a confirmation tone and the **#** will stop flashing. The handset will automatically be allocated the next available handset number. This handset number is shown in the handset display in standby mode. If the handset registration is unsuccessful, the **#** will still flash.

11. TROUBLESHOOTING

As a general rule, if a problem occurs, remove the batteries from all the handsets in your installation for about 1 minute, then disconnect and reconnect the power supply to the base and reinstall the handset batteries.

12. SAFETY
